My dear Father,

This place is about seven miles from the head of Okanagan L., on the E. side, & I got here yesterday from the direction of Nicola Lake. I got a swell mail at Okanagan P.O. at head of lake & too gain to thank you for papers received. The weather continues exceedingly fine & today is still quite oppressive but, but I am beginning to think of final return to Kowloos in the near future, as I have so much to do in office & have now completed the information required for sketchy map which it is intended to publish next winter. My reason for coming off here to the tentward is to endeavor to connect the rocks of Kowloos vicinity with those of the Gold Ranges etc.

Whether I shall succeed in doing so
 satisfactorily or not I do not know,
 as the sections are all very much broken
 up & it is often hard to make anything
 of them. I am aiming to get back to
 Kawlops about the 15th of next month
 & may possibly not be able to arrange
 for receipt of further mail till then.
 William went to suffer the back out
 by this time. I had pain him under
 date of Sept. 1st & he told me among
 other things that Rackine speaks of
 coming out to Montreal. As I have
 really nothing more worth present mention,
 I must beg you to consider this
 merely a report of progress to date.
