Dear George,

In reply to yours
of 14th I fear I cannot
give very definite in-
formation. No 1 may
be a Sequoia or a
Larix. No 2 has the
aspect of Podocarpites
but may be a Pinus
or a Palm leaf. No 3
has a curious resemblance
to Protococcus a genus I
have not seen in Canada
and No 4 might
be a Flabellaria.

The leaves are evidently
stem with a few
pores and much dis-
pends in new much
is imagnation

I may say in the
first place that no
such assemblage of leaves,
is known to me as
the Cretaceous, because
a Mesocene, and that
they have as much
resemblance to the
plants of the European
Eocene as to anything
else. I should think

The gigantic *Deudalium*
looks in that direction
also, but Mr Whittaker
can judge better as
to this.

If the leaves are
at all as well
preserved as the
drawings seem to indicate
it would be
well to send an
expedition to collect
some, as they seem
to indicate plants
