My dear Foster,

I have been following
some of your old tracks in this
part of the world I think, having
been along the Hudson shore &
up one of the brooks coming into the
Saguenay Valley. I then came
across from Kingsport to Parrytown
by steamer & drove to this place
by a very bad road. Today I
have been with Ami wandering
up Harrington River & tomorrow
we intend to drive to Sordmending
& get to Leuro by train in the
evening. If nothing calls we look

to Ottawa when I get there, I
propose going on to McCarra's
brook for a day or two, that
is in the Arisay vicinity. This
should complete what I can
usefully do at the present.

When at Woodville I got a barrel
of Gravstein apples, to be sent on
to your address. The freight will
be to pay on their arrival in
Montreal & you will please let
me know what it was when
it arrives. The apple harvest
is just beginning & I fancy
that there will be kept with
advantage in a cool place for
a few days after their arrival.
