Antigonish June 1

Dear Margaret

I left W. Glasgow in a
Wednesday after seeing you off,
and went pleasantly enough on
my way. We reached Antigonish abo-
out 6 o'clock, and stopped for the
night at Copland's Inn, where we were
very comfortable, though Mr Brown told
me in the morning that he had not
slept all night, his asthma troubling
him exceedingly when he lies down.

We left Copland's after an early
breakfast at $\frac{1}{2}$ past 6 and intended
to be at Polun's Lake this afternoon.
Before we reached Antigonish however
it began to rain, and soon became
a regular deluge in wet day. We there-
fore determined to stop here till to-
morrow morning, when if it be a good
day, we shall be early at the lake,
and shall return here in the evening. I
shall then return with Marshall on Monday
day, unless Mr Brown finds it necessary to

take him on further with him, in
which case I shall perhaps be de-
turned till Friday or Wednesday
& I shall likely call on Mr. Fulle
& some other friends this afternoon.

The rain will be exceedingly bene-
ficial to the farms & gardens. I hope
you have plenty of it in Picton. I do
not know whether you will think
of writing to me by Sunday's mail.
I will not expect it, at all events, and
thus will not be disappointed. Give
my love to Father & Mother and to little
James Connor. I hope you and he
were not the worse of your little ex-
cursion, and that you will take very
good care of yourselves.
