Dearest Margaret

I forwarded

to day a note which
I wrote yesterday & so
by way of sup's R; but
fearing that it may
not reach I now write
again.

To day unlike the
few past days was
fine and pleasant.
I went in the morning

At the place appointed
for our meeting and
soon had a large
assemblage. The meeting
was a very interesting
one, a number of people
speaking and making
resolutions. After the
meeting I had
dinner and then
drove on to an inn
ten miles from the

place of meeting with
the view of shortening
my journey of 3 days.
I expect to give this
note to the courier
whom I shall meet
by the way.

I forgot to ask if
there is no communication
that I could execute
for you in Halifax.
You spoke of a despatch, per;

haps I could get one
for you — Please
tell me when you
write. I am quite
well and have
got on very well these
few days. For this I
should be thankful.

too have been kept
in safety and health,
