boat with them.

General & lady Windham  
came here and stayed for  
a few days, but the whole  
family left yesterday for  
Murray Bay.

The day before yesterday sixteen  
arrived at the hotel, yester-  
day eleven left, & last  
night about a dozen arrived  
so you see we are constantly  
changing.

Mr King (I.S.) and family  
are down here now, the first  
morning after his arrival he  
hung up a thermometer &

barometer at the door  
both of which he is constantly  
observing. Would you  
get me a <sup>small</sup> swivel for  
trotting, it is such a  
nice lazy way of fishing, you  
just put your line over  
the end of the boat as you sail  
along, and now and then  
you catch a fine trout. The  
swivel is to keep your line  
from twisting, and tangling &  
let your bait spin easily. It  
can be got at any of the fishing  
tackle shops, I dont think  
it can be dear and you could  
send it in a letter. I ought  
to write letters to Anna, William  
Rankine, Eva & Robert this morning
