disposed. The Communion Table is  
the Lord's - not man's - And it is open  
to all who love the Lord - It has ever  
been my wont to invite such of the  
Lord's people as may be present, of  
whatever communion, to join with  
us in our blessed ordinance.

Many have hitherto done so, on their  
own responsibility, without in the least  
compromising themselves. Several of  
other Communions have signified to  
me their intention of doing so at this
