Rawlrops B.C.

My dear Mother,

I got back to this
Central Trail yesterday after a somewhat
prolonged absence, & since return
have disbandled & paid off my little
party & intend closing field work
for the season. We have had remarkably
fine weather which followed us till
the last, but last night a cold rain
storm in the valley & this morning
the tops of the mountains all whitened
with snow, so that we were
congratulating ourselves on being under
a roof. Of course this is not the

beginning of winter here & much
 fine weather is to be expected yet,
 but the days are getting short & the
 nights cold & I have besides so much
 of office work now accumulated.
 I hope to leave here tomorrow night for
 Victoria where I may have to stay
 three or four days after which I
 shall be on my way east & trust
 before long to see all at home
 again. I found on letters later than
 about a month or by return here,
 but suppose that you are all busy
 now & hope that no news is
 good news. William I believe
 is on his way west again & I
 shall try to find out when he
 is to arrive at Vancouver & see

him there. He is later than he had supposed he
would be as he wrote some time ago that he thought he
should pass through Rawlrocks about the 15, while I
have ascertained by telegraph that he is not on the train
to arrive tonight.
