My dear Mother,

I got back here from Vancouver about four this morning & have been very busy all day getting things in order for my int. Camps tomorrow. I had to wait several days at Vancouver to see Mr. Burnham & then got back as soon as I could. On arrival I received a Gazette of the 9th last with notice of Gov's marriage, & I trust that you have all got me the bundles & work attendant in the event & that everything passed off satisfactorily. The boxes I left here last autumn have all got through the winter in good shape & are got & I hope ready for work. The weather is fine but rather stormy for this normally dry County, with the result that the grass is even than usually green in

the hills & a promise of good crops.
On the lower Level everything is extremely
luxuriant & whole banks of roses in bloom
& wild spiraea, the same tall species
which grows ~~in~~ (or grew) in the garden
at home.

When in Vancouver I heard that William
was likely to come at again & today I
got a telegram from him dated Port Arthur
to which I replied, but fear that I may
not see him at least not for some time,
as he will pass through to further west
while I am off the line.
