Sept. 1. 1898

My dear Mother,

You will see that
I am still in the west; making
the wounds I had laid out being
taken longer than I had supposed.
Yesterday I stopped off here
simply to loaf for a day & am
going East as far as Calgary by
the same train today by which
this letter will travel. Tomorrow
I hope to be in Calgary & if
I do not hear that I am wanted
at once in Ottawa, prefer going
South to Ft. Macleod before setting

out on definite return journey.

A week, however, should now see
we not far from Ottawa. Weather
here is magnificent at present.

Thank Eva for her kind letter
which I got some time ago at
Edmonton.

I trust that all is going well
at Metis & still hope if you
should decide to stay there into
September to be able to run down
there for a short visit. Of course
the weather will be much to
do with your decision in the
matter of stay.
