Dear Grandmama

I was at the annual exhibition at the Art Gallery yesterday and they have a great many nice pictures, amongst them three small posters which were done by Margurite Bulles (Clare will know who she is) I have just finished drawing an Italian boy, mother thinks that it is quite good, but of course I would not like to say so myself! Bernard is eighteen today I made him a large shoe box of candy I gave it to him last night and it is nearly all gone by this afternoon. I am sure you must be enjoying yourself at Bermuda. So many people have told me how they envied you, and to be sure I envy you myself for it is mostly work and no play up here now. Mr. Heyden has not been up here ~~for~~ for some time but we expect him this afternoon. They girls up at Trafalgar had quite a spree the other night. They were going to have a midnight feast, and one of the girls who had been out in the afternoon promised to bring some cake back. So when she was in sight
