take - An injection she
will not have - She
is kept on Whiskey &
Milk & beef Tea. She
does not know she
is taking Milk, or
else she w. refuse it.
The lungs are worse
today. She is quite

Sensible - does not sleep
much without sleeping
Medicine - Dr. W. says
I should recommend dry
cupping, but I am
afraid it will excite her
too much. I believe I
have told you all I
can think of - is there
anything more can
be done? The fever seems
nearly gone but this
is the 27th day of
