My dear Mr. Dawson

I dare say you will remember my speaking to you about a girl Annie Cole who had been a R. Catholic & who after her conversion was being educated so as to become a school teacher. When we were both for she was boarding at the Y.W.C.A. in St. Catherine's St. & studying at the Normal School, she failed in her examination - now owing as she said to her not having sufficient time, for she was at the same time giving lessons at St. George's School, in order to help her to pay

her board. She was with
Lady Calth during the
wedding & after that she
went to the Grand Legion
Shipon, first more as a
helper, for which she received
her board, but in March
she wrote that one of the
Masters (Mr. Row I think
it was) said that if she
studied there for six months
she would then be able to
get a diploma & a school.
I helped her with this,
but now she writes
that the school has failed
for want of funds, so
that she is thinking of
remaining with the
English teacher & learning

from her. I should not think
this will be at all advisable,
nor enable her to take her
Diploma eventually -
She is a friendless girl whom
no one seems to have taken
up. I do not know how
to advise. If you or Mr. D^{ixon}
can give me any help
in the matter I shall be
much obliged to you - Could
she return now to the
Normal School, so as to pass
by the summer, or what
should be done to fit her
best for a teacher's spot
or in a position to support
herself? I do not think
we find a letter but it
seems a long time since
we have been changed apart -
But I have no doubt you

have been fully occupied &
I have been trying to make
up for the idle time during
Miss Keardi's illness. She
has recovered wonderfully
but she is only fit for an
idle life. She gives out
the hymns & occasionally
speaks a few words but
she is not fit to take meetings.
We are engaged about here
till end of May & then
(unless we return to
England) we purpose going
to Hallowood - Bethel &
Mustang. You are all well
with our love
