Steamer Union

Wednesday August 26
1867

My Dear Anna,

I write to you
as I suppose the others will not
yet have returned.

I received your letter last night
as I was going on board the
steamer for the Saguenay trip
and I write I am coming down
about an hour and a half from
Ladousac.

I am very sorry I did not
know that Papa wanted me
home this week, before, as
I have made all my arrange-

for leaving next Sunday
evening the 30th, and I
cannot now pack up quickly
enough to leave tomorrow,
and if I left on Saturday
I would have to stay
all Sunday in Québec,
so that Sunday is now
the earliest day that I
can leave, if all goes
well I shall leave
on Sunday evening and
be home Tuesday morning.

If you can please
let Papa and mamma

know so that they
may not expect me
sooner. I suppose you
have by this time received
my two former letters telling
of my intended day for
leaving, so that this
one is almost unnecess-
ary. I have had
a beautiful trip of the
Sequerway it rained
early in the morning
but has been fine all
day since, I shall
pack up all my things

Friday and Saturday, and
thus be able to leave just
Sunday evening. Please
excuse the writing as
the steamer is shaking
so much.

I will be very glad to
get home as there is
hardly anybody now in the
hotel.

Give my best love to
all at home and
believe me your ever
loving
George

I leave if I can.
