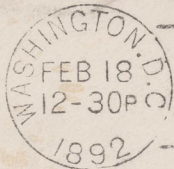

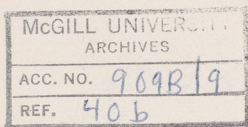

My dear Anna,

I have just reviewed
yours of yesterday's date
& think that your apology
about writing should have
been made by me, for I have
searched before for my dog in
that respect since I got here.

Yesterday I had in view the idea
of writing I wish you very
happy returns of your birthday,
but something intervened, & I can
only hope that it was not yet too
