Dear Anna,

I closed my letter yesterday
the in time for the mail, and
write a little supplement $\frac{1}{2}$ -day,
This place, Summerville, is a ^{wide} ~~wide~~
ridge of red sand giving a very
red soil like that of Pines Edward
Maud. It includes the city of
Augusta, distant about two miles,
and is covered with trees and
gardens & the abodes of the
wealthier citizens, with a
large space of grass and trees
at top partly wild & partly
occupied with the scattered
buildings of a U. S. Arsenal.

The hotel is prettily situated among trees, and is the smallest we have been at. If we find it suits us, we may continue for some weeks, as the climate is drier and more invigorating than that we have had further South. No more orange trees or palms, but some pines, elms, Prickly Ash trees, &c, some of which are just beginning to put out their leaves. There are however large Magnolias and many evergreen shrubs, and Gammas, Narcissus are blooming in the gardens.

I hope to get a few days of quiet here to write and read in, as well as to breathe the open air.
