My dear Anna,

apply. The expense would not be great, but I am not familiar with places or conditions there. There, however, are easily ascertained through doctors in Montreal who I am sure in the habit of sending patients there, & I feel sure that you would find no difficulty in establishing yourself there.

I have not been able to learn anything definite about Bayff, beyond the fact that both the C. P. R. Hotel & Dr. Brett's

place are both now in operation
 & that the charges of the Colln are
