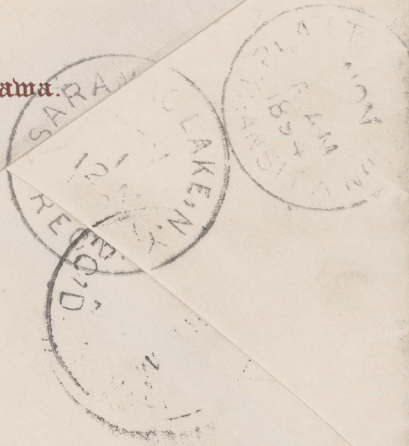

My dear Anna,
