I have been working very hard all day trying to finish the mortar analyses and have really finished everything but the calculation of the results which must be done to-night as the information is needed for the case on Monday. I have just got one for \$27 from Buss and another for \$24 from Birkett. I have the satisfaction, <sup>however,</sup> of having learned a good deal in working at the mortar.

Clare & Ruth have gone to the Tom Dolsons for tea & Conrad is going to bring them home. Con was up the Boney's for dinner to-day and brought back wonderful accounts of a new locomotive of Wilfuds which goes by steam and pulls a whole train after it. Clare went (with your mother)

He has given her some other  
medecine - apparently another  
preparation of iron. G. was  
awfully disgusted at having  
your mother go with her and  
was determined to go alone.

last, but has I fancy returned
