Our chemical apparatus
is arriving and there
are 40 cases in the Customs
at present which will

3 were broken.

I got no letter from Curtis
to-day, but probably you
did not write, thinking that
I would be in New York.

My cold is somewhat ²
better and I have had
very little neuralgia for
several days.

Mr. Flus told me today
that there was a possibility
of the afternoon train

much later than the
12th inst and that there
was even a possibility of
its being kept on for the
winter.
