Dear Mother,

I trust all goes well at
Little Metis. We have been having
very warm weather lately & to-day
it is like a furnace and all you
can do is to sit still and not
try to move. Gordon & I had
dinner up at Mrs. Law's on
Monday and they all were
very kind to us but we did not
stay long afterwards as I had to
get back to work. I received
the letter you enclosed from
Father and he only says that

they arrived ^{2.} safely after a good
voyage, that Bernard had been
overcome by some of the fair
sex, and that 'Bunny' was not-
very happy during the one
rough day they had that - is
all he said except that his
head was going round
so much that he could
not write any more until he
gained his land legs once
more. Nothing exciting or worth
mentioning has happened
here since I last wrote. I
think that I forgot to mention to
you that Sir Tom MacDonnell called
to see you & was surprised to find

that you had³ gone. I spent
last Sunday out at Lakeside
at the Drinkwater's place & we
had supper there returning home
on the 10 o'clock train. I have
been out of town several times
this week for which I was
glad because although very
hot it was not nearly so
bad as it was in the city
itself. I did some work at Dixie
on Monday & was doing some
work on Wednesday at St. Annes
near where the new Agricultural
College is being built. They
reminded me in the store the other

night - but now McGill was going
 in for agriculture they would
 probably in the course of the next
 year or so produce "odorous
 onions" there has been a
 man here all week doing
 stunts in a flying machine
 but - I did not get a chance
 to see him. Gordon sends
 his best - to the bunch. We
 are still quite friendly and
 have been able to tolerate
 each other so far. So had - to
 write more so love to
 every body
