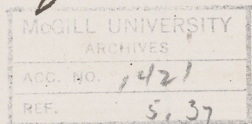

Thanks for yours

of the 6th inst. I was in Ottawa yesterday and in speaking to your Aunt about the specimens found here are quite a large number of them with quite a number of Indian curiosities &c. a relative of Mr. Billings was inquiring of Walker about them for Mr. Billings, who knows something about them. They are not ticketed nor are all of them, but some are, arranged in cases there is no person that I know of in Ottawa who could classify and arrange them. If they were sent to Montreal could you get

them arranged under your super-
visions, if not too much trouble,
if that could be done. I think
it would be less expensive than
for a person to come to Ottawa for
the purpose, as the expense is a
great consideration to these families
if there is any way you can
suggest for their disposal to the best
advantage they as well as I would
feel extremely obliged - and in their
circumstances if an early sale of
them could be effected it would be
of great assistance to them. With
regard to the late Dr. Estlin's of the
value it is of course largely
exaggerated - There are also
quite a large collection of Medical

works some of which are considered
valuable, but they will try and
dispose of them in Ottawa

I may possibly go to Montreal this
summer, but I have intended going
every summer since I got up Acadia
and it may be so this
summer.
