Dear Father,

I received your
letters + the key + it was
awfully foolish of me to go
away without it but all is
well now as I have it.
We left Göteborg in the teeth
of a gale and I never saw

managed to survive. We
arrived 9 hours late so I
missed all connections to
York + also to Liverpool so
I spent the afternoon + night

in Hull which² was not very interesting. I got to Liverpool at about 1.30 on Monday got some lunch + went straight to Aunt Evas + found her at home + she made me go right back + get my luggage + ~~go~~ come back here.

I went to the Allam line + found their boat for the tenth practically full up but the one on the seventeenth has still considerable space but I should wire Uncle H if you wanted to engage a passage. I had not time to go to the other offices as it was late then + to-day I went to

Manchester^{8,} with Uncle
H. as he had to go on
business he took me
& it was very interesting
& such a busy place.
The Shamrock has been
beaten twice so there
is no hope this time.
Pattinson goes over
on the boat with me
so that will be nice to
have a chap from
college with me. I hope
you are enjoying yourself
thoroughly & that you
are having good weather
where you are. Uncle
H says you should
go back by way of
Portland Me. I don't know

Why I am sure. I got some
letters from home &
all is well but there
is no new news of
any importance. I certainly
should let Uncle It
know at once about
your passage as all
the boats seem fairly
full. Some of the
Green Shields were here
to dinner to-night &
were very nice. I have

hoping all goes well
