I am sorry I was out when you called this morning. Sir William Logan tells me you wished to enquire whether you might consider your appointment as successor to D. S. In reply I may say that I consider your appointment definitely fixed, and that you will not be required to enter upon the duties connected with it till the 1st July next.
