My dear Sir,

I forward today as a
first installment of N.S. money
annuities a couple of forms
which I have lately got up
for use at the College. The
Payment is, I think, all that
is required but an acknowledgment
reading "Rebated" should
appear on the Coal of that
by comparison of which column
with the Coal "Booked" the loss in

Slack by backing could be
definitely arrived at. For
instance 100 tons of coal
as it comes from the pit is
found in bank April 1st. It
consists by estimation of 80
tons Runar. 10 tons Nat and
10 tons Slack when backed.
By some means it remains
unchecked till Sept 1st when
on receiving it is found to
consist of 40 tons Runar
40 tons Slack and 20 tons Nat
a serious loss resulting

from way deposit. This
additional weight of black
can only be shown by a special
column. Black to be legal
must pass through a $\frac{1}{2}$ inch
sieve, all else is subject
to Royalty of 10 cents per ton.

I also send a copy of
Blaker's Straw Pump circular
which may be interesting.

I have written to my Brother
in Cape Town from whom
I expect contributions of
Plant and Plans and will
continue to collect and forward
as fast as possible. A box

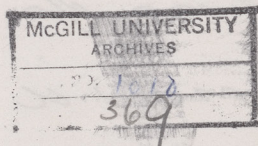
of Geological matters will
