Your favor of the 29th ult came duly to hand & in accordance with your request we beg to furnish you with the following few particulars with regard to the Mining & Extracting operations carried on by this Company during the past year -

Owing to the low price of Copper mining has not been carried on quite so largely as it otherwise would -

The quantities of ore raised during the year 1877 are approximately 1300 tons Cont^g 7% & 1600 tons Cont^g 3½% of Copper -

The 7% ore has been smelted in Cupolas & the 3½% ore treated by a Wet Process - The produce (Regulus & Precipitate) was up to the beginning of Oct last shipped to Britain but since the whole produce has been carried on by the Verbatory Furnaces to Block's Copper has been kept in Stock -

The number of men employed at the Mine averaged about 65 and the Extracting works about 35 -
