Dear Sir,

Your favor of yesterday has just come to hand. The specimens of copper ore which Mr Selwyn was to have analysed for me are from a lot in the vicinity of the Orford Mountains, about seven miles up the Magog River from Sherbrooke. The lode is a newly discovered one that was opened last fall. Some experts have given it as their opinion that the ore is rich in silver - one going so far as to say it will amount to \$20 per ton. It was to determine this point - that one party sent

that I forgot that I had to come  
on to Ottawa and <sup>expected that I</sup> would call

be another debate in the Senate  
on the question of the removal  
of the Geological Bureau to  
Ottawa, and if it comes up  
I shall forward you a copy  
of the official report of it.
