Manhattan Salt Mine

Godenck, Oct. 27 Feb 78

Dear Sir,

I am in receipt of your letter of 13th inst. and forwarded it to my brother Mr. H. G. Atwell, in New York, who I thought might be able to give you the information asked for. He has however, returned it stating his inability to do so; I regret that I cannot do so myself nor put you in the way of obtaining it. Our own work here is all preparatory work, as we do not expect to be down to the Salt beds in the next eighteen months at least.

In the matter of Salt Mining there has been, as far as I know, little or nothing done for the past twelve months, in this neighborhood, - there having been only one or two Salt Wells pumping brine and making Salt.
