I have at length  
got settled down and to work. I was very  
sorry not to be able to wait for your answer  
to my scrawl, but Dr. Dawson was kind  
enough to give me a letter of introduction  
to Prof. Bush, who was very obliging  
and introduced me to several of the Officers  
of the School. New Haven seems to be a very  
nice place, my course consists of German,  
French, Laboratory practice and recitations  
on analytical chemistry, Theoretical and  
Organic chemistry and Blow-pipe Analysis.  
They put me in the Senior laboratory at  
first, but promoted subsequently to the  
Senior department. There are about fifteen or  
sixteen students in the Chemistry course now,

I hope you are pleased with the specimens  
of the dykes. They were not studied much  
as I had to make a general survey of the  
township. The smaller specimens were  
your collection.

My lodging house is No. 26 Grumbell St.  
about two doors above Prof. Brush's.

About a week ago I took tea with the  
Professors and spent a very pleasant evening.

returns it to be rewritten if he thinks it  
necessary. Mine will no doubt be returned  
frequently. I must now close as the
