1 about  $8 \times 6 \times 4$  - frag. ments of very stout xls with some well form. xls \$ 30.00

1 about  $7 \times 3$  with

fine long well terminated  
crystals \_\_\_\_\_ \$25.00

1 7x4 lbs rather  
stout, 2-3 inch long 20.00

£ Besides these a large  
number of smaller speci-  
mens from 3x4 to 4x5  
inches ranging in price from  
\$5.00 - \$20.00

Have no Menighenite  
or Pennantite at present.

I rec<sup>d</sup> the last Pennantite about  
5 years ago from Mr Palling  
Cornwall with the remark  
that they were "very scarce in-  
deed"

If you wish any of the  
Stibnites I will send them  
on approval. They all have  
a very good lustre.
