I told him that it was best to send it to you to assay for copper and that if you had not time you could send it to Donald. He asked me to send it down to you and I accordingly sent it off this afternoon. It comes from the west

and is therefore of course from a gigantic  
vein. I have been very busy lately in  
making assays. Among others I have  
made three from Prince Edward's  
Island. In one only was there more than  
a trace and I have been able to prove  
to my great satisfaction by means of the  
microscope that the gold is in the form  
of filings. I sent down my application  
to be allowed to go up for my degree,  
some time ago, together with the necessary  
certificates to Prof. Bovey but have  
not heard whether he received it.  
We are very busy as usual in the  
laboratory here. Hoping to see you in

Montreal sometime soon, I remain
