Since you left me have had
three severe storms of wind & rain
the first on the Tuesday & Tuesday
night of your week. The second
on Tuesday the 8th which was
really terrific. I was in your room
looking of the window was closed

wind arose to its greatest fury - the

kinds of solid bodies whirling in it
Some of Mr Bethunes Chimneys were partly

squares. The Railway buildings were
unroofed. I am told but I have
not seen any newspaper account of
the damage & we get no town news
when paper is away.

his teeth & dressed himself for a week
