Dear George,

Your welcome letter arrived
 two days before yesterday and
 we are very thankful to know
 that you have escaped the perils
 of the sea, and trust that you are
 on shore and rested you will feel
 the better for it.

I enclose in this Bill
 of Lading of the Chain. The
 Agents of the Medway are
 Messrs. Tempestes Carter & Dark
 White Lion Court, Cornhill.
 The ship leaves on the 26th
 and should be in London
 Bay about the 6th or 7th
 of November. As the place
 is some distance from where
 you will lodge, your best
 course will be to write to
 these gentlemen in good time
 and give your address requesting
 them to send the chain to

your lodgings, which the agent
here says he thinks they
will do. I have paid the
freight - so you have only the
cartage & storage to pay, and
should ask the agents to
send a bill of this.

I have received a letter
from Ramsay, who says he
will not be in London
till December; but has written
& asks about you and
your fees, and when he
returns will see you. ^{My} Mother
has had a very kind letter
from Mrs Bell, and I trust
you will find many kind
friends and will prove your-
self grateful for any attention
they may show you. We shall
look for more detailed letters
this week or next, and in
the mean time remain
with all love your father's
