I thank you for

new view of them that they
belong to a *Radularium* what
he calls but what
I believe not to be *Radularium*
but probably *Stenolophus*

payments that you make as
my *ape* and I shall credit
them to you.

Mr. Mill of Stra, Maine, who
loaned me the *Law of Paphetes*
from the *Logans* & take to

up the box for me, so that
if he is done with it he
may give it for the
endless. Merrill values it

think and report us &
what would be next
best if this fails.
