to hand to day, also the compass all day
I was 2 days at Bullens since I wrote
last to you — there is a brook at
Bullens named Saug Brook, it cross
cuts the Timent — I observed 2
small veins close to each other about
15 inches each, 1 foot of rock between
them, and not so hard as the one
on Bullens farm — Bullens is 200 yds
N 45 W. from the brook — Bullens
farm is 1/4 of a mile wide showing
ore all across. boulders of large
size and plentiful — Premsen
writes me ^{Bullens} was outside the right of
search and that they took it up
since — I reported to them — I
made no prospecting since the 18th
of Nov our country is covered.

with snow 6 inches deep and not
very frosty — if you have a plan
of the ^{search} sight of "Look at No 115"
at this place the continuance of
the ore is found and from app-
earance is likely for to be
good. it is strongly magnetic
so much so that no compass
needle will move when
over the vein — the compass
needle will move when I place
the ore within 1 foot of the ~~ore~~
needle — at the same place
I seen boulders of Limonite
very plentiful 150 Yds East
on inquiry I found they
are common all along this
side of the river &c in a few
days I will send a plan &
report.
