native work in the shape of a
large blanket made entirely
from the wool of the mountain
goat. The cost will be \$15.00
& should you not require
it I will keep the same
for myself, but I consider
the same very cheap &
a most valuable specimen.
I have also ordered the
samples of tobacoy to which
silver ore also samples
of stone rounds copper
fine samples of potash

carrots &c. all particulars
will be forwarded to
you regarding them.
I would mention that
I can buy for \$8.50
a fine specimen of
wood duck & crossed
grouse both in glass
cases. If you like
to have them please
let me know.

Our skins & Elk horns
can be purchased in
town also any kind
of fur. I shall be
happy to follow your
orders in any other
matter you may require.
I may mention that I
have spoken to the
