Your notes on the locust ^{*C. spatiosus*} invasion of 1874 prove so useful to me that I write to ask you to kindly send me, as soon as published, your article on those observed in 1875, as I am engaged in writing an account for Prof. Hayden's Survey of this insect, especially of its work of destruction in 1875. Have you any more data concerning its northern and eastern distribution in British America? Those taken in Maine & Mass. It is not infrequent in N. Hampshire & I have it from California. I have doubt it occurs all over the colder portions of Canada, but in rare comparison with *C. ferrug. rubrum*, with which in distribution it intergrades. I do not believe in Mr. Riley's atlantis, or its varius in different regions.
