official files on both sides.

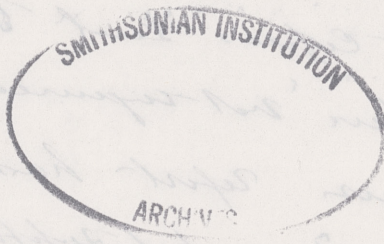
