Dear George

I have been here for  
two days, examining fine  
Canadian tertiary limestones  
which occur in Schistose and  
conglomerate rocks here, which  
Hannay mapped in 1862  
They are called Canadian  
and Schistose, but which  
it is now the purpose to  
call Pre-Cambrian. They  
are mostly dolomitic and  
Canadian were taken up  
first; but my fear is  
they are of Schistose and  
them as rather Canadian



than Europe. That also  
 takes of finding the  
 locality of my old specimen  
 of *Serpentaria* or *glaucomaria*  
 from the concretion from  
 "Lougouet" which they call  
 the place called here  
 "Lougouet"; but after  
 much searching I cannot  
 find it. Hope St. Pierre has  
 conversed with me as guide  
 and helped me to  
 return to day via Beaumont,  
 and by Angers with me  
 some specimens of the supposed  
 fossils and rocks; but I fear  
 little to them and very  
 light on pre-Cambrian life.
