SECOND ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
PARKS AND PLAYGROUNDS ASSOCIATION
OF MONTREAL.

The Committee deeply regrets the loss, during the year, of its Vice-President, Mrs. Kenneth Macpherson, who was one of its original members.

In presenting the following report the Parks and Playgrounds Committee desires to express its appreciation of the encouragement given to its efforts during the past year, and also of the increased interest which is being displayed in the work of the Association.

Before touching on the developments which may be realized during the coming summer, it seems fitting to bring before the Association some particulars regarding the work accomplished during the summer of last year. Two playgrounds were kept open during July and August, viz.: The Royal Arthur and Berthelet Street, and assistance was given to the Dyke Playground, Point St. Charles. These playgrounds were as much appreciated as before. The Royal Arthur and Berthelet Street grounds were visited by fourteen thousand six hundred and

sixty-two children and young men—an increase of seventeen hundred and twelve. The average attendance per week at the Royal Arthur was six hundred and fifty ; during the last week the attendance reached the astonishing number of eight hundred and eighty-seven. As in the previous summer, these yards were under the supervision of matrons and instructors. The sand gardens were perpetually overcrowded. Swings and trestle tables for quiet games were introduced and were most popular. At the Royal Arthur ground, the younger children were not only amused, but the older taught to read, and a very creditable list of garments then made is given in the report of this yard.

The experience of last summer seems to show that the Berthelet Street Playground, while of great service, is not sufficiently near to the poorest and most crowded part of the city, and the Association is making every effort to secure a playground further east.

A committee from the Grand Trunk Literary and Scientific Institute applied to the Association last summer for a grant to enable them to develop the Dyke Playground, which was most readily given. The money was used to purchase wood for the erection of two small shelters, the provision of benches, and a water tap. This ground was much frequented. The Dyke Superintendent reports 25,000 adults, and 36,000 children as having visited it in the course of the summer. The bathing in shallow water was most popular and it is hoped this year to erect two bathing sheds.

A good roadway from Ash Avenue to the Dyke is much needed, also two good lights.

The Association hopes to bring this matter to the notice of the City Council. No complaints of any moment were made

concerning the general behaviour of the children. The influence of the teachers was shown in the most marked manner by the improvements effected in the behaviour and appearance of the children at the end of the season.

Early in the summer application was made to the Board of Roman Catholic School Commissioners for the use of Plateau Street School yard because there was no suitable playground at all for the poor of the East end. In reply the Board expressed its sympathy with the objects of the Association but preferred to open the yard under their own management and only to the children attending the school.

The main development of the Association during the coming summer will be the opening of the Charlevoix Playground, Point St. Charles. This extension of the Society's work will confer great benefit on a locality which lies remote from the playgrounds already open and which is sorely in need of a large open space for its numerous children. Fortunately a capacious space of ground was placed at the disposal of the Association by the City Council in 1901-'02, but owing to lack of funds, it has not been possible to use it until now. From the Charlevoix Playground the Committee expects that great good will accrue to those living in the immediate neighbourhood. This playground is being prepared for use, and, so far, the ground has been levelled and sown with grass, a good painted fence placed around it, with endowments for maintenance, at a cost of seven hundred dollars, and it will probably require one thousand dollars in addition to lay out walks, plant trees, erect shelters and provide a pond for the small children.

When it was contemplated to open this ground it was felt that the additional expenses thereby incurred could not be met

in the ordinary way. Accordingly the Committee resolved that an amateur dramatic entertainment should be given in order to raise the extra funds required. The comedy "One Summer's Day" having been chosen, that play was presented in the Academy of Music on December 14th by a number of amateurs, ladies and gentlemen, to whom the heartiest thanks of the Committee are due. The especial thanks of the Committee are also due to Mr. Mackay Edgar for his most efficient services as stage manager ; to the members of the Dramatic Committee ; to Miss Ruth Harrington for designing posters and programmes ; to Mr. Wotherspoon for undertaking the preparation of the ordinary programme ; to Mrs. Herbert Redpath and the young ladies who kindly sold programmes ; to the theatre management ; to the warden of the Royal Victoria College for allowing the use of a hall for rehearsals, and to the press. The net proceeds of the entertainment were \$673.09.

Through the efforts of the Finance Committee a special appeal was made to the public by circulars, four thousand being distributed, and in response \$477.35 were received.

A collection was also taken up in the Sunday Schools.

The hearty thanks of the Association are tendered to Mr. Herbert Wallis for his kindness in giving a lecture on Jamaica in the Grand Trunk Literary and Scientific Institute, Point St. Charles, for the benefit of the Association.

In the report of the Association for last year mention was made of steps to be taken to secure incorporation. The bill for incorporation will be presented to the Legislative Council during the present session and there is every reason to believe that it will pass the House. To the bill has been added a provision enabling the Association to become trustees of any

pretty bits of scenery within easy access of the city. In connection with this matter, it might be stated that the Trustees of Public Reservations in Massachusetts already possess six tracts of land, with endowment for maintenance, some of which were made over to them to perpetuate the memory of friends. No more fitting and lasting memorial of those who have passed away could well be imagined.

The warmest thanks of the Association are tendered to its legal advisors for valuable advice and assistance ; to the Protestant Board of School Commissioners for granting the use of the school yards : to the Fraser Institute for lending books, and to the Press for their kind co-operation : also to Mr. Todd, Prof. Penhallow, Dr. Tait McKenzie, Prof. Nobbs, Mr. Robertson and Mr. Gardner for kind interest and advice.
