

Your mother had three light heart spells they were sort of sinking spells. I gave her adrenalin and then called Dr. Hebard. He had me give her coramine. She took one ampule a day for three days and then she seemed to get better. Now she is able to sit up in a chair, not every day but about two or three times a week. I am now giving her digitalis twice a day, fifteen drops each time. She is eating good and seems bright and cheerful. She does not seem to recognize anyone that comes to see her, or if she does, she forgets about it as soon as they are gone. She seemed to recognize you at the time, but now she has forgotten all about your being here.

We have had some very hot weather, but today it is raining and your mother feels so much better. She is sitting in her chair, and she fed herself this morning.

They seem to be very good to Grandma and she seems to feel that she is at home which funnily enough she did not feel herself to be while she WAS at home. She told me she was exhausted from having thirty two from Minneapolis out for the day. She seems to have the baby on her mind and when I come in she asks me if I brought it with me, and talks about it. However, she does not seem to be unhappy now and I suppose it is really better than if she had physical suffering like Grandpa's.

About us, as for myself, I am disgustingly well. I am bored to death with waiting, with my peculiar appearance, and my ponderous appendages. We are planning to move in a week or two regardless.

Did you know Daddy has had Grandma's house repainted on the inside and had the floors refinished for renting and then they will rent it either furnished or unfurnished whichever way they can get the most desirable tenants and turn the rent into the trust fund. The house really looks so much better I wish you coud see it. Daddy says that if they rent the house unfurnished they would have to store the furniture as it is against the law to sell it, so to save the storage rate Kenny and I could use it. We are certainly hoping such will be the case as prospective landlords do not seem very interested in renting their places to us as soon as they know about the baby. Did you have that complication once or did you always have your own furniture?




