

To the Stockholders:—

YOUR Directors submit the Company's Fourteenth Annual Report and Statement of Accounts. Total revenue amounted to \$16,586,558.62, an increase of \$1,372,103.24 over the previous year.

The net earnings for the year before interest, bond discount, depreciation and income taxes, were \$4,166,357.42, an increase of \$367,967.03 over the previous year.

The net profit for the year, after all charges, bond discount and reserves for depreciation, bad debts, etc., was \$1,368,988.85, an increase of \$37,579.16 over the previous year; and net income after provision for income tax was \$1,243,988.85, an increase of \$32,579.16 over the previous year.

On June 1, 1927, the Company retired the outstanding balance of its Seven Per Cent. Debenture Notes in amount of \$125,000.

Through operation of Sinking Funds the Company's Five Per Cent. Debenture Stock and Six Per Cent. First and General Mortgage Gold Bonds outstanding in hands of the public, were reduced in amount of \$443,743.27.

The Company's property has been maintained in sound physical condition; adequate new passenger and freight terminals at Toronto were completed and put in service; one bulk freight Upper Lake steamship and four bulk freight canal type steamships were purchased; two package freighters and one passenger steamship which were under construction at the beginning of the year, and two additional package freighters were completed and put in operation; two new passenger steamships were under construction and one new self-unloading type of collier was under contract of purchase at the close of the year.
