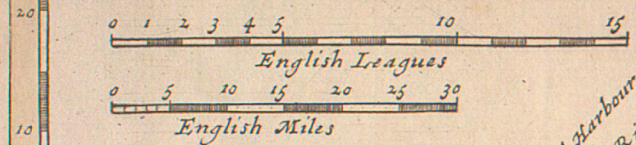

Note. That 3 or 4 Leagues without Desert Rock the Tide or rather a Current sets to the Southward, And to the Eastward of the said Rock, there is a strong tide sets E.N.E. &c. W.S.W. up and down the Bay of Fundy, only near the shore you have the Indraughts and out sets of the Bays and Rivers.
 At Annapolis Royal and St. Johns or Megones Bay a S. 1/2 E. Moon makes full Sea, there the tide rises and Falls five fathom, at Minas Ten: and at Chignico Seven, where at S. 1/2 W. Moon; its full Sea.
 From Cape Anne in New England to Mount Desert Rock is N.N.E. 30 Leagues
 From Mount Desert Rock to Port Royal Entry E. by N. 38 Leagues
 Latitude. Mouth of Port Royal Entry 44-50. Mount Desert Rock 44-25. Mount Desert 44-45.
