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
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MITCH KLEIN & LES JONAS, co-producers of "Ye Gods!" are no stangers to the Revue. Mitch was last year's Business Manager, and Les has acted as well as written script in the past two years.

DON JOHNSTON in his third year with the Revue, has risen to the position of Director. When in High School he worked on the technical end of the show, and since coming to McGill has written script and danced for the Revue. He has also had extensive experience in summer stock, including dramatic work in the United States this past summer.

JACK KETCHUM, choreographer of "Ye Gods!", graduated from Hope College in Holland, Mich. After graduation he won a dancing scholarship with Edna MacRae. He later became a lead dancer with Ballet Intime and the Fine Arts Ballet in Chicago. He danced under the direction of Agnes deMille in the road production of Oklahoma. He is now with Brian Macdonald on CBC television.

LOUIS DONOLO, a 2nd year Engineering student, has constructed our sets and is our technical director. Although new to the Red and White Revue game, his experience in both building and construction have shown up in his excellent work.

LENORE SCHWARTZMAN, our set designer, has had much experience in designing with shows at McGill and Hillel during the past two years. She is very interested in art, and is in her third year in Fine Arts as a partial student.

MORRIS SHOHET has been with the show since his first year at McGill. As a writer he has doubled up on both the McGill Daily and the Red and White Revue, rising to a position on the Managing Board of the Daily and Script Co-ordinator for the Revue. He is a third year engineering student.

RON CLARK, a second year Commerce student, is Musical Director of "Ye Gods!". Not at McGill last year Ron picked up some radio experience, and two years ago, besides playing in the show he wrote the ballad "Here's Hoping" in "Naughty for Knowledge". Ron began writing music at eight years old and some of the leading publishers and singers of the U.S.A. are now in possession of some of his songs.

CLARENCE BLATT is the Finance Director of this year's Revue. Last year Clarence worked as assistant Finance Director, and for two years he acted as treasurer of his fraternity. Clarence is a third year Commerce student.

PETER SALZER, a final year Art's student who has done publicity work for numerous organizations including last year's Revue, the Annual, the Player's Club, and Open House, is the Publicity Director of this year's Revue. He has appeared in English Department productions such as Hippolytus, Measure for Measure and the Caprice of Marianne.

BEVERLY BARTRAM, a second year Arts student, is in her second year with the Revue in the position of Secretary and General Manager. Although she has acted, sung and danced in several productions in High School in England and the United States, she hopes one day, when she isn't busy behind scenes, to appear in the Revue.

CYNTHIA VAN LAW & JILL MANSON are co-personnel directors of the Revue this year. Cyndy is a second year Arts student, was originally slated to appear as one of our dancers. Unfortunately, due to a ski mishap, she had to give up the ballet slippers for a pair of crutches. Jill, a second year honours English and Philosophy student is featured as lead dancer this year—her second season with the Revue.

CORINNE COPNICK, playing June and Marie Antoinette, has had extensive theatrical training. Lately she has appeared in plays with the Moutain playhouse, and with the English Department and the Player's Club in McGill. Miss Copnick has been heard many times over CBC and is presently playing in "Laura Limited", a popular soap opera.

PETER HALE, playing the roles of Apollo and Louis XVI, got his original start while singing in the shower at St. Andrews College. He played the female lead in the Mask and Wig Show at the University of Pennsylvania, and an American Statesman in last year's Revue. He hails from Hamilton.

JOAN FISH plays Cleopatra in this year's Red and White. She played a lead role in "Berkeley Square" for last year's Westmount High Dramatics production. At present she is in first year Arts.

LORNE BARRATTE, a fifth year Architecture student, hails from Newfoundland where he played in the usual high school productions and variety shows. This year, as Ceasar, is his first year with the Revue and is also his first experience with musical comedy.

DIANA FISH, who plays Mandy Lou, is an active member of the M.R.T. and Grosvenor Productions in Montreal. She is in her final year at McGill and hopes to graduate from Occupational Therapy.

DON MACSWEEN, a third year Arts student, while having as his profession that of square dance calling, has done considerable work in monologues. In West Hill High, he played in the Production "I Remember". In the Revue, he is seen as Lopalong in the Western scene, which he also wrote.

MIKE FISH has had no experience since sixth grade elementary school, when he played a walk-on part in the "Christmas Carol" by Dickens. He plays the roles of Marc Antony and Joe Vendredi in "Ye Gods!", but perhaps should have been limited to walk-on parts. Mike is in fifth year Architecture.

MORTON JAY LITWACK, played no less than five different parts in last year's Production of "Love Amiss". He is back again this year acting two majors roles: Pluto in the opening scene and The Gutrot Kid in the Western. At present Morty is trying hard in 3rd year Science.

STAN FEFFERMAN, who plays the role of Mars in "Ye Gods!", has had several years of stage experience. In 1953 he won a talent show in Strathcona Academy and he has since played roles in several "Y" productions.

JUDY SOCOLOW, a first year Arts student is a graduate of Strathcona Academy, where she appeared in school productions. Judy has starred in Saul Honigman's camp productions of "Country Living" and "Village of Champlain". In the current production of "Ye Gods!" she will be seen as Venus.

WARNER DEWEY, is a second year medical student, who is not sure whether medical studies and a part in the Red and White Revue can be negotiated successfully together. This is his first experience in any dramatic production since high school and his initiation into an attempt at dancing. This had unwittingly led him into the role of lead male dancer.

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
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
