## Fortunes Told by the Face.

First impressions, in the study of faces, are always the most reliable. A perfectly formed face should be divided in three equal parts; from the root of the hair to the root of the nose, thence to the tip, and from the tip of the nose to the tip of the chin.

### Eyes.

Black, sparkling eyes, with a steady, grave mouth, show taste, elegance and sound judgment.

The eyes should be distant from each other exactly the breadth of one eye; a greater distance indicates slowness of apprehension; a less distance, cuteness.

Half shut eyes show natural shrewdness, together with a lack of sincerity.

Slow moving eyes are always found in the heads of persons of prudence and ability.

Gray eyes are generally found associated with prudence and foresight.

Blue eyes belong to people of an enthusiastic turn of mind.

Black eyes are the most rash and impetuous.

Brown eyes are the most kindly.

## Forehead.

Smooth fine hair, of whatever color, shows native good taste and intelligence.


Black hair belongs to the most powerful organizations. Yellow to the most delicate. Red to the most ardent.

### The Life Line

A long and well-traced life line, equal in all parts, and of a rose color, is the sign of a good constitution and a long life.

If the life line joins the head line above the thumb, and forms a regular angle, it indicates that the person will be wise and prudent in all things. If, on the contrary, the head and life line do not touch at all, it is a sign that the head is not in accordance with the life, and for the sake of executing a project once formed all else will be forgotten, even personal happiness and safety.

A double life line indicates an excess of vitality.

A life line that stands on Jupiter indicates immense ambition and success.

## SUGGESTIONS.

Take time to eat your meals. It is not time wasted. Eat slowly and enjoy your meal if you can. Regarding the advice to "leave the table hungry," we are at a loss what to say. Personally we do not observe this rule. We endeavor to have an appetite when we go to the table, but confess we are not very hungry when we leave it. But many persons eat too much and too rapidly, and drink altogether too much at their meals. Diluting the fluids of the stomach with large draughts of tea, coffee or water must necessarily retard digestion, and often produce dyspepsia. One cup of tea or coffee at a meal should be sufficient. Much cold water directly before or after a meal is injurious. Don't eat too much, bearing in mind that there is greater danger of this, than of eating too little. Although the appetite is not always a safe guide, yet one should not eat till one is hungry.

Observe regularity in taking your meals, and in attending to the calls of nature. Attention to this latter will save you much discomfort. Keep the person clean by frequent baths. Sleep in a different undergarment from the one worn during the day. If troubled with cold feet in winter, sleep with a jug of warm water at the feet, as you cannot be well if your feet remain cold.

The proper observance of these suggestions will contribute to your comfort, health and happiness.

## CRIME IN HIGH PLACES.

It is not strange that some people do wrong through ignorance, others from a failure to investigate as to the right or wrong of a matter.

But it is strange, that individuals and firms, who are fully aware of the rights of others, will persist in perpetrating frauds upon them.

A short life line, badly drawn and of unequal size, designates a weak constitution.

A clear, deep and long life line signifies a person of vigorous constitution and of a long life.

### **The Heart Line.**

A long, clear and pure heart line indicates great affection and devotion.

A heart line beginning and ending with branches indicates a good and rich nature. If these branches begin under Jupiter, and ascend towards that finger, the character will be all the more beautiful and noble.

A heart line without branches indicates a timid person.

If the heart line towards its extremity joins the head line, it is a sign that the head will master the heart.

A broken heart line is fatal only when found in both hands.

Persons having no heart line will never be influenced by sentiment.

If the heart line is crossed by other than the principal lines of the hand, it indicates a very sensitive person.

A heart line formed like a chain indicates a person of undecided affections.

### **The Lucky Line.**

The line of Saturn (the lucky line) starts from the base of the lower part of the hand, or near the wrist, and ascends more or less directly towards the middle finger.

A clear, straight and pure lucky line, starting directly from the wrist through the plain of Mars to the middle finger, after having dug deep into the mount at its base, indicates happiness without alloy; gifts, money and uninterrupted success.

The head line extending towards the Mount of the Moon indicates very great intelligence, much more ideal than positive.

The head line extending into the Mount of the Moon indicates people governed by imagination, finding happiness in dreams and illusions, apt to pay little attention to their own interest.

The head line extending into the percussion, or outer edge of the hand, denotes a person who is master of himself and has an eye to his own interest.

The head line when clear and pure from beginning to end indicates a clear brain that is not easily troubled; but if unequal in regard to size and depth, denotes a mind not sure of itself.

The head line not adjoining the life line signifies caprice, imprudence and discontent. An accompanying line is always a good omen wherever found.

### **The Sun Lines, or Lines of Reputation.**

The sun lines are one or more vertical lines which cross the mount at the foot of Apollo, or the Sun, and cut deep into it, dividing it like a ravine.

When coming from the hollow of the hand, or plain of Mars, it indicates success after a great struggle; from the head line success would be based on calculation, or personal interest; but where they leave the heart line, it indicates success due to great generosity of soul.

A single line of the sun divided in two as it ascends signifies force neutralized by division.

If it divides into three parts it indicates a desire for glory, riches and talent, which, for the above-named reason, will remain only a desire.

If the three lower branches unite and form one single line as they ascend, it signifies the union of fortune, reputation and merit.

### **Bracelets.**

At the wrist where it joins the palm there are always one or more lines in the form of a bracelet, which indicates length of life, happiness and riches.



Four parallel bracelets, well defined, straight and equal, indicate a life of more than one hundred years.

Three bracelets indicate ninety years, if clear and well cut.

Two bracelets, sixty years; one, thirty.

### **The Division of the Fingers.**

Each finger of the hand has three divisions, called phalanges, and separated from each other by the joints of the fingers.

## Information for Builders.

One thousand shingles laid four inches to the weather will cover one hundred square feet of surface, and five pounds of shingle nails will fasten them on.

One thousand laths will cover seventy yards of surface, and eleven pounds of lath nails will put them on.

Eight bushels of good lime, sixteen bushels of sand and one bushel of hair will make enough good mortar to plaster one hundred square yards.

One-fifth more siding and flooring is needed than the number of square feet of surface to be covered, because of the lap in the matching and siding.

Five course of brick will lay one foot in height on a chimney; sixteen bricks in a course will make a flue four inches wide and twelve inches long.

Eight bricks to a course will make a flue eight inches wide and sixteen inches long.

A cord of stone, three bushels of lime and a cubic yard of sand will lay one hundred cubic feet of wall.
