



Dainty Dishes For the Invalid

In acute diseases such as typhoid fever, pneumonia, etc., nursing becomes of the greatest importance and one of the chief duties of the nurse is the preparation of dishes which will at the same time tempt the appetite and nourish the body of the invalid.

Strength must be kept up and wasting prevented, but the delicate state of the patient's digestive organs must be considered, and since liquids are more easily digested than solids the diet must consist largely of milk, beef tea and broths.

Scrupulous cleanliness is indispensable; tact and perseverance in order to ensure that enough nourishment be taken, is important and variety in preparation is necessary.

With the object of assisting the nurse in this invaluable part of her duties we are including in this little book a number of recipes for the preparation of delicacies for the invalid and believe that mothers, who are the nurses in the great majority of homes, will find them worthy of preservation.

ANAEMIA OR BLOODLESSNESS

DAINTY DISHES FOR THE INVALID

EGG BROTH.

Yolk 1 egg. Speck salt.
1 tablespoon sugar 1 cup hot milk.

Brandy or some other stimulant if required.

Beat egg, add sugar and salt. Pour on carefully the hot milk. Flavor as desired, if with brandy or wine, use about one tablespoon.

EGG-NOG.

1 egg. $\frac{3}{4}$ cup of milk.
Speck salt. $1\frac{1}{2}$ tablespoon wine

1 tablespoon sugar or less of brandy.
Beat the egg, add the sugar and salt; blend thoroughly, add the milk and liquor. Serve immediately.

MILK PUNCH.

1 egg. 1 wineglass sherry.
 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup cold water. Nutmeg.
Sugar.

Beat the egg. Heat the water and wine together but not boiling; pour onto the egg, stirring constantly; flavor with sugar and nutmeg.

TEA PUNCH.

Few beverages find readier favor during the hot weather than tea punch. To make it, pour boiling lemonade, sweetened to taste, over the tea leaves, and allow the liquid to stand until cold. Then strain and serve in tall glasses, with shaved ice and slices of lemon.

EGG LEMONADE.

1 egg. 2 tablespoons
2 tablespoons lemon juice.
sugar. 1 cup cold water.

Beat the egg thoroughly, add the sugar and lemon juice; pour in gradually the water, stirring until smooth and well mixed. Strain and serve.

| | |
|----------------------------|---------------|
| $\frac{1}{2}$ cake yeast. | 1 tablespoon |
| $1\frac{1}{2}$ tablespoons | water. |
| sugar. | 1 quart milk. |

Make a thin syrup of the sugar and water and cook one minute. Soften the yeast in two tablespoons of lukewarm milk. Heat the milk until lukewarm, add other ingredients and shake. Bottle and place in upright position for twelve hours, and keep in cool place. Ready for use after the first twenty-four hours, but the longer it is kept the less palatable it is. It should look like thick, foamy cream. Kumyss is especially suited for many forms of indigestion, nausea, fever and gastric trouble, pulmonary consumption and other wasting diseases.

FLAXSEED TEA.

| | |
|--------------------|----------------|
| 1 tablespoon | Juice 1 lemon. |
| whole flaxseed. | Sugar. |
| 2 cups cold water. | |

Wash flaxseed thoroughly, put it with the cold water in a saucepan, simmer one hour, add lemon juice and sugar to taste and strain. If too thick, add hot water. Valuable in case of inflammation of the mucous membrane.

BEEF TEA.

| | |
|----------------------------|-------|
| $\frac{1}{2}$ pound steak. | Salt. |
| 1 cup cold water. | |

Wipe steak, remove all fat and cut in small pieces. Add cold water and soak fifteen minutes. Put in a jar and cover; place on trivet in kettle and surround with cold water. Allow water to heat slowly; do not have it reach a temperature higher than 150 degrees Fahrenheit. Cook two hours. Strain and season.

WHEY.

1 cup fresh milk. 1 teaspoon cold
 $\frac{1}{4}$ Junket Tablet. water.

Heat the milk until lukewarm; add the tablet dissolved in the cold water. Allow it to jelly in a warm place. Break up the curd and strain through two thicknesses of cheese cloth, being careful to remove all the casein. Serve cold, with or without sweetening, and flavor as desired.

OATMEAL GRUEL.

$\frac{1}{4}$ cup coarse oat- meal. $1\frac{1}{2}$ cup boiling water.

$\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon salt. Milk or cream.

Add oatmeal and salt to the boiling water, and cook four to five hours in a double boiler, adding more water if necessary. Strain and dilute with hot milk to make it of the right consistency. Reheat and serve.

LEMON MILK SHERBET.

1 cup milk. 2 drops lemon ex-
 $1\frac{1}{2}$ cup sugar. tract.

Juice $\frac{1}{2}$ lemon.

Blend all ingredients and freeze as you would ice cream.

INSOMNIA

| SMALLPOX | Small red pimples, changing to vesicles, then pustules | 3rd day of fever, or after 48 hrs. illness. | 14-21 | Great pain in back and intense headache. Scabs from 9th to 10th day, fall off about 14th. |
| TYPHOID FEVER | Rose-colored spots scattered. | 11th to 14th day. | 22-30 | Accompanied by diarrhoea. Seldom infectious. Usually from bad drainage. |

- Four teaspoonfuls liquid—one tablespoonful.
- Four tablespoonfuls liquid—one wine-glassful, or half a gill.
- Eight tablespoonfuls, or two wine-glassfuls liquid—one cupful or one tumblerful.
- One cupful liquid—two gills, or half a pint.
- Two cupfuls, or four gills—one pint.
- Two pints—one quart. Four quarts—one gallon.
- One tablespoonful butter—one ounce.
- One lightly rounded tablespoonful Cottolene—one ounce.
- One rounded tablespoonful flour—half an ounce.
- One cupful butter—half a pound.
- One rounded cupful Cottolene—half a pound.
- One rounded cupful flour—one quarter pound.
- Four cupfuls flour—one quart or one pound.
- Three cupfuls corn-meal—one pound.
- Butter the size of an egg—two ounces.
- Butter the size of walnut—one ounce.
- Two cupfuls granulated sugar—one pound.
- Two and one-half cupfuls pulverized sugar—one pound.
- Two cupfuls brown sugar—thirteen ounces.

DIPHTHERIA

Sore throat is not always a marked feature of diphtheria in the early stages. Especially in the cases of children the throat should be carefully examined when the following symptoms manifest themselves:—

| 1 teaspoon granulated gelatin. | 1 teaspoon lemon juice. |
| 1 teaspoon cold water. | 1 tablespoon cherry wine. |
| 1 tablespoon boiling water. | 1½ tablespoons sugar. |
| 3 tablespoons peach juice. | |

Soften the gelatin in the cold water and dissolve in the boiling water. Add fruit juice, wine and sugar, strain and pour into a cold, wet mould.

CREAM TOAST.

| | |
|----------------------|---------------------------|
| 1 tablespoon butter. | 2 tablespoons cold water. |
| 1 tablespoon flour. | 1 cup milk. |
| 1 saltspoon salt. | 3 slices toast. |

Scald milk. Mix flour and salt and add the cold water gradually, making a smooth, thin paste. Add to scalded milk; cook in double boiler twenty minutes; stirring constantly until it thickens. Add butter. Pour over toast and serve hot.

BARLEY WATER.

1½ tablespoon pearl barley.
1 quart cold water. Salt.

Wash barley, add cold water and let soak several hour or over night. Drain and add the fresh cold water, boil gently over direct heat two hours, or in a double boiler steadily four hours, down to one pint, adding water from time to time; season with salt. Strain through muslin. Cream or milk may be added or lemon juice and sugar.

RICE WATER.

2 tablespoons rice. Salt.
1 pint cold water. Milk.

Wash and pick over the rice; add cold water and cook until rice is tender. Strain and dilute with boiling water or hot milk to desired consistency. Season with salt. Sugar may be added if desired, and cinnamon, if allowed, may be cooked with it, and will assist in reducing a laxative condition.

OATMEAL WATER.

1 tablespoon oatmeal. Speck salt.
1 quart boiling water.
1 tablespoon cold water.

Mix oatmeal and cold water, add salt and stir into the boiling water. Boil three hours; replenish the water as it boils away. Strain through cheese cloth. Season, serve cold.

JUNKET.

1 cup fresh milk. 1 teaspoon cold
¼ Junket Tablet. water.

Heat the milk until lukewarm; add the tablet dissolved in the cold water; allow it to jelly in a warm place; chill in cool place.

DAINTY DISHES FOR THE INVALID

BEEF BROTH.

3 pounds solid meat from the shoulder or shin. 3 pounds bone from same.

4 quarts cold water.
2 teaspoons salt.

Take off the dried skin and any soft or bloody portion. Cut the meat into small pieces and put it with the cracked bone into an earthen jar. Cover with the cold water. Set in slow oven and cook from eight to twelve hours. Strain through a colander. Add salt to taste; cool quickly. When cold remove the fat. Serve cold or hot, but do not allow it to boil.

RICE MILK.

1 ounce rice. 1 saltspoon salt.
1 pint scalded milk. 1 teaspoon sugar.

Soak rice twelve hours, strain and add the scalded milk, salt and sugar. Stir well and cook slowly one hour. Rub through a fine sieve and season to taste. Sago or tapioca may be used in the same way.

EGG BROTH.

1 cup hot beef broth. 1 teaspoon salt.
1 egg.

Beat the white and yolk of egg separately. To the yolk add gradually the hot broth, stirring continually. Add the salt and fold in the well-beaten white. Reheat and serve very hot.

BRONCHITIS

OYSTER STEW

| $1\frac{1}{2}$ tablespoons water. | 1 tablespoon butter. |

Scald the milk. Put oysters in a strainer placed over a bowl, and add water. Carefully pick over oysters to remove particles of shell. Heat the liquor which has drained from the oysters to the boiling point, and strain through a fine strainer or cheese cloth. Put in the oysters and simmer, but do not boil, until they begin to grow plump and the edges curl and separate. Strain the liquor into the scalded milk, season, add oysters and serve immediately.

LIME WATER.

Directions.—Slake one ounce of lime by the gradual addition of one-half cup distilled water, and shake occasionally during one-half hour. Allow the mixture to settle; pour off the liquid and throw it away. Add one gallon more of distilled water to the lime, shake thoroughly and wait a short time for the coarse particles to subside, then pour the liquid into a glass stoppered bottle. Pour off the clear liquid when it is wanted to use.

WHOOING COUGH




Showing the Plaster as used for Pleurisy.
