




Hay Fever.

Hay fever bears a close resemblance to acute catarrh, and is so called because it comes on during haying season, and is caused by breathing in minute particles from certain grasses and flowering plants. It is very sudden in the onset, and unless checked will continue all season. Hay fever is accompanied by sneezing, exudation of mucous, sometimes exciting spasmodic asthma, pains through the body, and sometimes chills and fever. The blood is propelled by the heart and flows through the arteries and capillaries, then back to the heart through the veins.

It is the red corpuscles that give the red color to the blood. The weight of the blood is about three twenty-fifths of the weight of the entire body. The blood plasma carries nutrition to the tissues.



The blood consists of a fluid called plasma and round globules called corpuscles. The corpuscles are of two kinds, red and white. They can only be seen with a microscope, and average one three thousand five hundred part of an inch in diameter.

THE BLOOD

The blood is the liquid by means of which the circulation is effected. It flows through every part of the body except the cuticle, nails and hair. The average quantity in each person is about eighteen pounds. It is composed of a thin, colorless liquid (plasma), filled with red disks, or cells, so small that 3,500 placed side by side would measure about one inch. They have a tendency to collect in piles like rolls of coin. These red disks contain the oxygen, so essential to every operation of life. When the oxygen is exhausted the blood is sent coursing back to the lungs, where it comes in contact with the air we breathe, and absorbs more oxygen.

Arteries and Veins.

Arteries are tube-like canals, which convey the blood from the heart, while the veins bring the blood back to the heart. It has been estimated that a portion of the blood will make the tour of the body in about twenty-three seconds, and that the entire mass passes through the heart in from one to two minutes.

The Pulse.

At the wrist and on the temple we can feel the expansion of the artery by each little wave of blood

set in motion by the contraction of the heart. In health there are about seventy-two pulsations per minute. They increase with excitement or inflammation, and weaken with loss of vigor. As they are modified by nearly every disease, the physician finds the pulse a good index of the state of the system and character of the disorder.



THE KIDNEY



This plate shows the kidney cut through the middle, revealing the interior: 1. Suprarenal capsule. 2. Cortical substance. 3. Medullary substance. 5, 5. Cavity of kidney. 6. Pelvis of kidney. 7. Ureter, which conveys the urine from the kidney to the bladder. It is through these delicate and sensitive passages that the gravel or stones pass from the kidneys to the bladder, causing the most excruciating pains. The symptoms are marked by cutting pains in the loins, a feverish condition, sympathetic pains in the hips. The urine is apt to be bloody, and there is a constant desire to pass it. The treatment is the same as for kidney disease.


BOILS

THE TONGUE



Much may be learned from the appearance of the tongue. It is the physician's surest guide to the diagnosis of disease. The cut shows the appearance of the tongue when health is good. This should abate any fever; and if the pain still continues, the following remedy may be taken and the liniment applied locally; Iodide of Potash, quarter ounce; Salicylate of Soda, half ounce; Morphia, half grain; water, eight ounces; mix, and take a tablespoonful every four hours in a little cold water. Tincture of Aconite, half ounce; Oil of Wintergreen, half ounce; Chloroform, one ounce; Spirits of Camphor, four ounces; mix, shake and rub well into the parts affected.





THE LUNGS



The above cut is a good representation of the lungs in the latter stages of consumption. As consumption advances portions of the lungs are destroyed, leaving hollow spaces, called cavities. Except when consumption follows pneumonia, cavities usually form at the top of the lung first. A shows a cavity partly filled with pus; B, a cavity entirely empty and dry; C, pus in bottom of cavity; D, D shows small cavities in the apex of each lung; E, E, small cavities at the base of each lung; F, F, healthy lung and bronchial tubes.
