# GENERAL RECEIPTS.

---

## INDIAN BISCUIT.

*Time.*—To bake, about forty minutes.

*Articles.*—Meal, a pint; butter, two ounces; two eggs; milk.

*Directions.*—Wet the meal well with boiling hot water, put in the butter and a little salt, beat two eggs very light, and add when cool; stir in enough milk to make a batter, beat well and bake in a hot oven.

---

## EGG MEAL BISCUIT.

*Time.*—To bake, half an hour.

*Articles.*—Meal, a pint; butter or sour milk, a pint; one egg; lard, a tablespoonful; salt, a teaspoonful; soda, a teaspoonful.

*Directions.*—Work the lard into the meal and salt; beat the egg, stir into the milk, add to the meal; then add the soda; if the milk is sweet, use two teaspoonfuls of tartar. Bake in a moderate oven.

## SEMOLINA PUDDING.

*Time.*—Ten minutes.

*Articles.*—A quart of new milk; half a teacupful of semolina orange marmalade.

*Directions.*—Put the milk into a Teakettle Boiler, and when boiling, stir in the semolina, and continue to stir it over the fire for ten minutes; then put it into a mold to cool, turn it out, and serve with jam or marmalade round it. It is delicious iced

---

## SPANISH PUDDING.

*Time.*—Ten or twelve minutes to fry.

*Articles.*—Half a pint of milk one ounce of butter; some flour; yolks of three eggs.

*Directions.*—Put the milk and butter into a Tea-kettle Boiler, and just before it boils dredge in sufficient flour to make it a thick dough, stirring it all the time with one hand as you add the flour; then take it off the fire, and stir in, one at a time, the yolks of three well-beaten eggs, mixing each well in before adding the other; then put it on a dish. Fry it in small round pieces in boiling butter until a light brown. When done drain them from the fat, and serve on a folded napkin, with sifted sugar over them.

## PORK PUDDING.

*Time.*—Boil from three to six hours.

*Articles.*—A cup of chopped pork; two cups of chopped raisins; a teaspoonful of soda; five cups of flour; three cups of milk; one coffee cup of molasses; one cup of dried apples.

*Directions.*—Chop up the pork, raisins, and dried apples together, mix the flour with the milk and molasses, desolve the soda in a little water, and add; then mix all together, put into a cloth, and boil, the longer the better, up to six hours, Serve with rich sauce.

## MOCK GREEN APPLE PIE.

To five soda-crackers add five cups of boiling water; cover in a dish, let them soak; add three full cups of sugar, two lemons—grate the rind, and add both rind and juce. Bake with two crusts.

## MOCK APPLE PIE.

One large grated lemon, three large soda-crackers, two even tablespoonfulls of butter. two teacups of sugar, one egg, a wine-glass of water, pour over the crackers. These will make two pies. Bake with two crusts.

## SWEET POTATO PIE.

Boil and sift through a col-

lander any sweet potatoes, add milk, boil in the tea-kettle boiler and make the same as pumpkin pie; or bake, boil and slice, same as sour apple pie.

## CELERY WITH MILK.

*Time.*—To boil the celery, three quarters of an hour.

*Articles.*—Six heads of celery, a pint of milk, a piece of butter rolled in flour, nutmeg and salt.

*Directions.*—Take celery, cut them about three or four inches long wash them very clean and boil them in water until they are tender, put in the milk, mix the butter and flour, and a little salt and grated nutmeg, boil it up till it is thick and smooth, put it in the celery, warm it up and serve with the sauce poured over it.

## EGG SAUCE.

*Time.*—Twenty minutes.

*Articles.*—Two eggs, a cup of butter; a little salt; a cup of milk.

*Directions.*—Boil the eggs hard, shell them, cut them up into small square pieces; melt the butter with milk into the Tea-kettle Boiler, heat it very hot, add the salt, put the chopped eggs into a saucer bowl and pour the butter over the eggs.

# THE HAIR,

How to Preserve and Restore Its Color, Strength and Beauty.

In the fatty cushion between the true skin, or in the true skin, are small glands, consisting of saccæ, having papillæ at their bottom supplied with nerves and blood vessels, from which last the blood is formed, the hair as it grows towards the surface, passes through a tube into which are oil ducts open for the purpose of oiling the hair.

The color of the hair is owing to the coloring matter in the cells.

Besides the respiratory matter and water thrown out upon the skin, there is also a constant scaling from the dust, which is called dandruff. Too much or too little indicates an unhealthy condition of the ducts.

The hair protects the brain from heat and cold. The eyebrows prevent the perspiration from flowing into the eyes.

The hair in the nose and eyes protects the openings from dust and insects. The hair on the upper lip guards the mouth and lungs from cold and dusty air.

The beard protects the throat from cold. Young men are generally ambitious to wear whiskers;

to do this it is only necessary to shave every day. The rules applying to cleaning the hair, oiling, dying, will apply to whiskers.

Causes of the loss of hair and color of it are numerous, but as it is so important to know, we shall explain them, for too many of our women and men are daily using nostrums to prevent the hair from falling out, turning gray, or fading, yet violating the simplest laws of nature that keep the hair good.

1st. General debility of the system.

2nd. Sickness of a severe nature.

3rd. Anxiety, hard study.

4th. Mental and bodily over stimulation.

5th. Ringworm, excessive frights.

6th. Curling the hair in stiff paper.

7th. Braiding or twisting it too tight.

8th. Wearing hats or any covering over the head too much.

9th. Old age, venereal excesses.

10th. Continued use of many vile mixtures, sold to prevent

11th. Using other persons' combs and brushes.

*To Preserve the Hair.*—Wash the head well with water and Castile soap.

It should be dried thoroughly (the hair wash can be used if prepared) the hair should be brushed daily and particularly at the roots of the hair, and after bathing it also pass a fine tooth comb through it night and morning, for several minutes to let the air through, as it revives the hair. By strict attention to the above the hair will improve in softness, lustre and firmness and less liability to baldness.

*Hair Brushes.*—The use of a moderately hard brush for the head keeps up a healthy circulation, and is on every account to be preferred to the employment of a comb.

The scurf, as it is called, which collects on the head from neglect, arises not from, at least only in a very small degree, the dead cells or scales being thrown off, but from the evaporation and hardening of the secretions which are poured out on the scalp.

#### POMADE AGAINST BALDNESS.

The following is considered a good preparation:—Take of extract of yellow Peruvian bark, fifteen grains; extract of rhatany root, eight grains; extract of burdock root and oil of nutmegs (fixed), of each two drachms; camphor, (dissolved in spirits wine), fifteen grains; beef marrow, two ounces; best olive tar, one ounce; citron juice, half a drachm; aromatic essential oil, as much as sufficient to render it fragrant, mix and make into an ointment. Two drachms of bergamot and a few drops of otto of roses would suffice for perfume.

#### WASHING CARPETS.

Carpets can be best washed on the floor; thus—first shake them and then after cleaning the floor stretch and nail them upon it, then scrub them in cold soap suds, having half a teacupful of ox gall to a bucket of water, then wash off the suds with a cloth in clean water, set open the doors and windows for two days or more. Imperial Brussels, Venetian, Ingrain and three-ply carpets can be washed thus, but Wilton and other plush carpets cannot. Before washing them take out grease spots with benzine.

Sympathetic with this is a sensation of itching at the anus and at the nostrils, producing a disposition to scratch the fundament and to pick the nose, which is

highly characteristic of this affection. The bowels are often disordered, being sometimes constipated or stopped, and sometimes relaxed, with occasional bloody discharges, as in dysentery. The discharge is sometimes in shreds or flakes, which are not unfrequently mistaken for fragments of the partially digested worms. It is not uncommon for portions of undigested food to pass the discharges. The appetite is exceedingly variable; in some cases natural, in others deficient, craving or depraved; one condition not unfrequently alternating with another. The belly is often hard, swollen and tympanic, the breath heavy or fetid, and the tongue furred with a disagreeable taste and a copious flow of saliva. Swelling of the upper lip, bleeding of the nostrils, and a disposition to grind the teeth during sleep are other characteristic symptoms.

The effects, however, often extend beyond the alimentary canal, and various derangements of health are experienced in consequence either of the direct irritation of the worms, or of the disordered digestion which they occasion. Among the most common of these are nervous affections, such as fretfulness, irritation of the temper, wakefulness or disposition to excessive sleep,

disturbed sleep, sudden starting out of sleep as if from fright, dizziness, headache, spasmodic movements of the eyelids, dilated pupils, perverted vision, temporary blindness and partial deafness. General convulsions are not infrequent in children, and symptoms strongly resembling Hydrocephalus have been ascribed to worms, and have ceased on their expulsion. Cases of Chorea or St. Vitus Dance, Melancholia and Hypochondria, and even insanity, have been referred with the most apparent reasons to the same cause. In addition to these affections may be mentioned obstinate cough, spasm of the glottis, palpitation, languid circulation, pale or yellow skin, sunken eyes, a livid circle about the eyelids, and general emaciation. This condition is often accompanied by fever, and is then called worm fever. Persons in apparently perfect health may be affected with worms, and it is no unusual event to find worms in the bowels of persons after death, who have given no sign of their presence during life.
