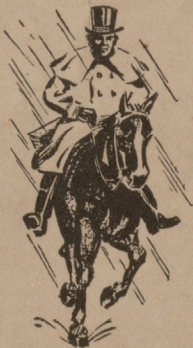

Moon's Man — 12 Signs of the Zodiac



ARIES—Ram
Derived from the first Babylonian month when sacrifices of rams were made.



TAURUS—Bull
The name is the result of the ancients' conception of the sun as a bull.



GEMINI—Twins
This name celebrates the legend of the twins who were reared by a wolf and built Rome.



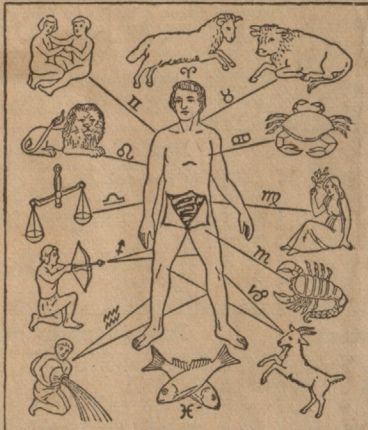
CANCER—Crab
Here the retreat of the sun is associated with the backward motion of the crab.



LEO—Lion
The Lion was the ancient symbol of heat here used to indicate the hottest month.



VIRGO—Virgin
The sign commemorates a Babylonian myth of Ishtar.



LIBRA—Balance
Represents the equality of day and night at this season.



SCORPIO—Scorpion
Represents the darkness with the sun's decline after the autumnal equinox.



SAGITTARIUS—Archer
Named after the Babylonian God of War, a horse-man archer.



CAPRICORNUS—Goat
Here is commemorated the legend of a goat that nursed the young gods of the sun.



AQUARIUS—Water-man
This sign is derived from the heavy rains of the Nile.



PISCES—Fishes
Ancient symbol of life after death—here means the resumption of labor.



THE names of the twelve Zodiac signs have been handed down by the astronomers of ancient civilization. The generally accepted version of their origin and the symbols of the Zodiacal constellations as shown above, is most interesting.

Eclipses and Almanac Information for 1933

During the Year There will be Two, **REBULARY** How to Use the Moonlight Diagram

Eclipses, Both of the Sun

1. An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, February 24. Visible to North America, the southern half of South America, the South Atlantic Ocean, Africa, except the north-west corner, south-western Asia and the Indian Ocean.
2. An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, August 21. Invisible to North America, visible to the north-eastern part of Africa, eastern and eastern Europe, Asia, except the north-eastern part and Australia.

at any particular date; let your eye follow on a straight line to the Moonlight diagram, the heads of columns in which will tell you the hours of the night, the black squares thus denote the hours in which it will be dark; the white squares bearing the Moon's face in any of its phases thus denote the hours during which moonlight will shine; and by the particular phase, about how much light to expect.

On the signs face the left, the waxing Moon is indicated; if the right, the waning Moon, while the New Moon is \odot and the Full Moon thus \ominus . The white squares bearing in them the Sun's face thus * * * indicate sunlight in the early evening and morning hours.

Morning and Evening Stars

Mercury will be Evening Star about March 6, July 2 and October 28; and Morning Star about April 10, August 17 and December 11.

Venus will be Morning Star till April 21, and then Evening Star the rest of the year.

Mars will be Morning Star till March 4, and then Evening Star the rest of the year.

Jupiter will be Morning Star till March 9; then Evening Star till September 27; and then Morning Star again the rest of the year.

Saturn will be Evening Star till January 27; then Morning Star till August 5; and then Evening Star again the rest of the year.

Chronological Eras

The year 1933 of the Christian era comprises the latter part of the 1574th and the beginning of the 158th year of the independence of the United States of America, and corresponds to the year 6646 of the Julian period.

Of the peoples using the Christian era some employ the Gregorian calendar and some the Julian. January 1, 1933, Julian calendar, corresponds to January 14, 1933, Gregorian calendar.

The year 7442 of the Byzantine era begins on September 1, 1933, Julian calendar.

The year 5694 of the Jewish era begins on September 21, 1933, or more exactly, at sunset on September 20, 1933, Gregorian calendar.

The year 2686, since the foundation of Rome, according to Varro, begins on January 1, 1933, Julian calendar.

The year 2593 of the Japanese era, being the 8th year of the period Showa, begins on January 1, 1933, Gregorian calendar.

The year 2245 of the Grecian era, or the era of the Seleucidæ, begins in the present-day usage of the Syrians on September 1, 1933, or on October 1, 1933, Julian calendar, according to different sects; but in the ancient usage of Damascus and Arabia Petraea the year begins with the vernal equinox.

2,427,074 is the Julian day number of January 1, 1933, Gregorian calendar.

How To Live 100 Years

Note—The calculations for this almanac are given in local or mean solar time; the risings and settings of the Sun and Moon being for the upper limb, corrected for parallax and refraction. To change to Standard Time, 4 minutes are to be subtracted for each degree of longitude, the place is east of the standard meridians, and 4 minutes added for every degree west of the same.

Never use dyes of this type during the menstrual period.

bleached fairly well with lemon or cucumber creams. Never use mercury creams. Wrinkles are due to the collapse of tissues below the skin. Massage morning and evening, aided by a tissue cream, will erase tired lines and guard against deeper wrinkles if started in time. 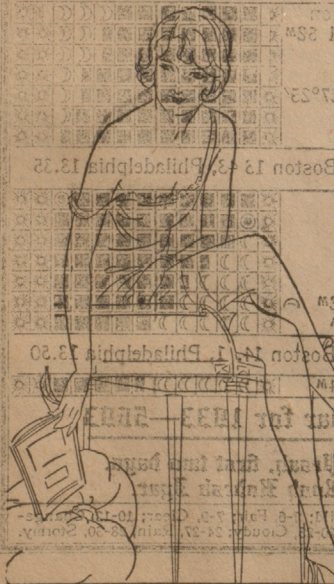

First Aid to the Injured or Poisoned

First Call a Doctor

If the sufferer is in a faint or unconscious condition, lay on back, raising feet higher than head. Fan freely and put cold water on the face and chest. Inhaling ammonia or smelling salts, held near nose, often revive.

Don't put anything in the mouth.

Water if incontinent may cause choking. Unconscious persons cannot swallow.

If conscious, cold water frequently revives and helps the liver slowly in sips.

Stroke of Paralysis. Do not give stimulants. Loosen clothing. Elevate the head.

Put cold water on the face and chest. Keep the body and feet warm.

Foreign Bodies in the Eye. Pull the upper lid downward away from the eyeball over lower lid and release.

Burns and Scalds. Cover with cooking soda and lay wet cloth over it. Whites of eggs and

gives of Olive or linseed oil, plain or mixed with chalk.

Lightning. Dose of water over person struck. Perform artificial respiration.

Fainting. Place on back; allow fresh air and sprinkle with water.

Shock, fainting, and cold. Give stimulant in small doses, once in fifteen or twenty minutes and secure warmth by external applications and rubbing.

Bleeding from wound. If from an artery, stop the current of blood to the wound by putting a compress of cloth pad over the artery. Fasten it firmly by handkerchief or bandage which may be tightened by twisting in a stick as a binder. The location of the artery can generally be determined by the throbbing sensation. If

from a vein, apply pressure directly over the wound.

Disinfectant. Berchloride of iron may be applied with water for 1000.

Wounds. The part should be properly cleansed of all foreign matter, the edges brought together and fastened with strips of plaster, apply antiseptic solution, give stimulant, laudanum with brandy, if necessary.

Bruises. Apply Dr. Jayne's Liniment; keep well covered and warm with witch hazel.

Poisoned Wounds. From a bite of animals treatment should be prompt. If possible suck the wound thoroughly two or three minutes; cauterize with either nitric acid, chloride of zinc or nitrate of silver, use whiskey freely internally.

Stings of Insects. Apply spirits of ammonia.

Poisons. General Directions—Give an emetic as soon as possible; tablespoonful of powdered mustard in a tumbler of warm water, or twenty grains of ipecac, or rich milk or whites of eggs in large doses, after vomiting, give freely of warm drinks.

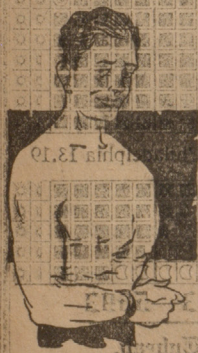

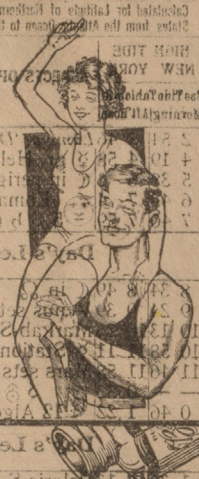

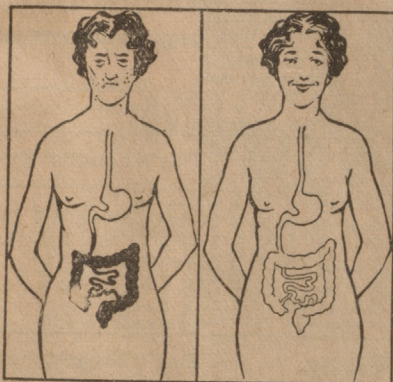

Canning Hints for Thrifty Housewives

The syrup used for canning fruits may be thin, medium or thick.

Thin syrup is one cup of sugar boiled with three cups of water.

Medium syrup is one cup of sugar boiled with two cups of water.

Thick syrup is one cup of sugar to one cup of water.

Sugar and water are mixed, stirred to dissolve sugar and brought to a good boil. It may boil from three to five minutes if fruit juice may be substituted for water where it is possible and the flavor will be improved.

Cherries—Pit or not as desired. If not pitted, prick them with needle to prevent shrinkage. Wash, stem and pack in jars. Cover with thick syrup if sour cherries, medium if sweet. (Make syrup of cherry juice if possible). Process in quarts 25 minutes in boiling water.

Berries—Can as fresh as possible. Put finest berries in jars and crush the others, to make a juice for a medium syrup. Cover with boiling water. When canned this way some berries are apt to shrink considerably and so must be packed carefully to fill jars as much as possible. Or you may put them in a kettle using quarter pound of sugar to each pound of fruit and set this in boiling water, heat to boil, stirring as carefully as possible and boil five minutes, then fill the jars at once and process for 10 minutes.

Peaches and Apricots—Peel by scalding. Make a medium syrup and after packing fruit firmly in jars (leave two seeds in each quart jar), pour the boiling syrup over to fill jars and process 30 minutes if fruit is hard, 25 if soft.

Always pack the fruit with cut side down. MAKE PEACHES CUT FROM SMALL IMPERFECT FRUIT. Peel and cut it into small pieces or wash to a pulp. If wanted very smooth, force through a sieve. Add sugar, white or brown, using half a pound to each quart or half a measure to each full measure of pulp. Cook carefully until of the consistency desired. Then pack in sterilized jars and seal, half the juice of a lemon to each two quarts of this will give a good flavor.

Pears—Cut in half, core and peel. Pack in jars; fill with thin syrup and process 30 minutes if pears are hard, cook them from 4 to 6 minutes, according to their size, in the boiling syrup before packing them in the jars. Cover them with the syrup in which they cook and process for 20 minutes.

Rhubarb—Cut in inch lengths, using only young tender stalks. Pack in containers and cover with boiling medium syrup. Process 30 minutes. Or, cut in inch pieces, mix with one-quarter as much sugar, cover and bake in the oven until tender. Then pack at once in sterilized jars and process 10 minutes in boiling water.

Gooseberries—Wash, pick over and pack into jars. Cover with a thick boiling syrup. Process 30 minutes.

Plums—Use barely ripe fruit. Wash and prick each plum with a large needle. Pack in jars and cover with medium syrup. Process 20 minutes.

Huckleberries—Use second method given for berries.

Weather Wisdom

RISING BAROMETER: Unsettled weather is indicated by a rapid rise, settled weather by a gradual rise and fine weather by a rise with southerly winds. After rain a rise with dry air and increasing cold in the summer indicates better weather. Wind and rain from northward are indicated by a rise with moist air and low temperature.

FALLING BAROMETER, with westerly wind, indicates stormy weather. Storm with hail and rain in the summer is indicated by a fall with northerly wind. In the winter a fall with dry air and increasing cold indicates snow. After calm, warm weather, a fall indicates rain and squalls.

A gray, lowering sunset, or one where the sky is green or yellowish green, indicates rain. A red sunrise, with clouds lowering later in the morning, also indicates rain. A halo after fine weather indicates a storm. A morning rainbow is a sign of rain, an evening one of fine weather.

A deep blue sky, even when seen through clouds, means fair weather, a growing whiteness an approaching storm. Fogs indicate settled weather. A morning fog usually breaks up before noon. Unusual clearness of the atmosphere, or unusual twinkling of the stars or unusual brightness indicates rain.

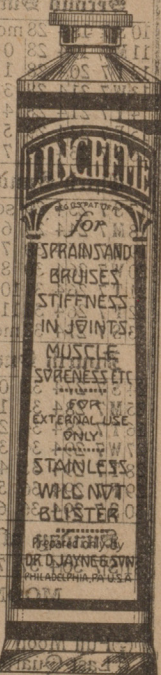

This table and the accompanying remarks are the results of many years' actual observation, the whole being constructed on a due consideration of the attraction of the Sun and Moon in their several positions respecting the Earth, and will by simple inspection, show the observer what kind of weather will most probably follow the entrance of the Moon into any of its quarters, and that so near the truth as to be seldom found to fail.

OBSERVATIONS.—The nearer the time of the Moon's change, first quarter, full and last quarter are to *midnight*, the fairer will be the weather during the next seven days. The space for this calculation occupies from 10 at night till 2 next morning.

The nearer to *midday*, or *noon* the phases of the moon happen, the more foul or wet weather may be expected during the next seven days. The space for this calculation occupies from ten

in the forenoon until two in the afternoon.

The observations refer principally to the Summer, though they affect the Spring and Autumn nearly in the same ratio.

The Moon's change, first quarter, full and last quarter happening during six of the afternoon hours,—from four to ten,—may be followed by fair weather; but this is mostly dependent on the *wind*, as is noted in the table.

Though the weather from a variety of irregular causes is more uncertain in the latter part of Autumn, the whole of Winter and the beginning of Spring, yet the above observations will be found to apply to these periods also.

To prognosticate correctly, especially in those cases where the *wind* is concerned the observer should be within sight of a good *vane*, where the four cardinal points of the heavens are correctly placed.

Prize-Winning Recipe

by Lillian Cassels, Famous Culinary Expert

(Original Recipe)

Tillamook Devil Cake

Two and one-eighth cups cake flour
1 teaspoonful baking powder
1 teaspoonful baking soda
 $\frac{1}{4}$ teaspoonful salt
 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup butter
1 cup light brown sugar
1 cup white sugar
4 eggs
 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups milk
4 squares Baker's unsweetened chocolate
1 teaspoonful vanilla

Directions: Shave chocolate; add 1 egg yolk, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup milk, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup brown sugar, and heat in double boiler until melted and incorporated, stirring during cooking to blend smoothly. Set aside to cool while assembling rest of materials and mixing cake.

Cream together remainder of sugar and butter. Add to this the beaten yolk of 3 eggs, blend well.

Sift cake flour once; then measure; then sift together with baking powder, soda, and salt, two times.

Add remainder of the milk to the creamed egg and sugar and butter mixture, alternately, with the flour, until about half of flour is used. Then beat in the cooled chocolate mixture; this should not be chilled too long, however, as it will grow too stiff. When this is well incorporated, then beat in rest of flour. Add vanilla. Lastly, fold in beaten whites 2 eggs.

Bake in three 9-inch layer cake pans, preferably using pans with sliding bottoms, to insure cake turning out without breaking. Bake at 325 degrees (slow oven) 25 minutes. Do not use high heat.

Using the two whites of eggs left from cake, make a seven-minute icing, and spread this thickly between layers and over cake.

Seven Minute Icing

Use the two egg-whites left from cake. Add $\frac{1}{2}$ cups granulated sugar, one-fourth teaspoonful cream of tartar, 5 tablespoonfuls cold water; blend with rotary egg beater, in upper part of double boiler. Cut 18 marshmallows in pieces.

Place mixture over rapidly boiling water; beat continuously for seven minutes; adding marshmallows during the cooking period.

Should the cooking not be very fast, it may be necessary to continue cooking another minute or two. Icing should be quite thick, smooth and fluffy.

Take from fire, add 1 teaspoonful vanilla, beat until slightly cooled, then, spread.

Cut additional marshmallows in pieces, and set around edge of cake as a decoration; or use in any desired design on top of cake.

Especially Important Points of Law

Principals are responsible for the acts of their agents.

Contracts made on Sunday cannot be enforced in some states. Written contracts concerning land must be under seal.

Notes do not bear interest unless it is so stated.

If a note is lost or stolen, the maker is not released if the consideration and amount can be proved.

Demand notes are payable when presented, without grace, and bear legal interest after a demand, if not so written.

An endorser on a demand note can be held only for a limited time, variable in different states.

To be negotiable a note must, either be made payable to bearer or be properly endorsed by the person to whose order it is made.

If the endorser desires to avoid responsibility, he can endorse "without recourse."

Notes becoming due on Sunday or a legal holiday are, as a rule, payable on the day following.

A note made on Sunday, or one dated ahead of its issue, is void but it may be dated back.

If a note is altered in any way by the holder it becomes void.

A note made by a minor is void in some states and is voidable on judicial decision in others.

A contract with a minor or a lunatic is void. If a note is not paid when due, the endorsers, if any, should be legally notified to be holden.

A note obtained by fraud or given by an intoxicated person cannot be collected.

It is a fraud to conceal a fraud.

Signatures with a lead pencil are good in law. The acts of one partner bind the others.

Each individual in a partnership is responsible for all the debts of the firm except in the case of a special partnership.

The word "limited" in connection with firm names indicates a limitation of responsibility for each member.

An agreement without consideration of value is void.

"Value received" should be written in a note, but it is not necessary. When not written, it is presumed by law or may be shown by proof.

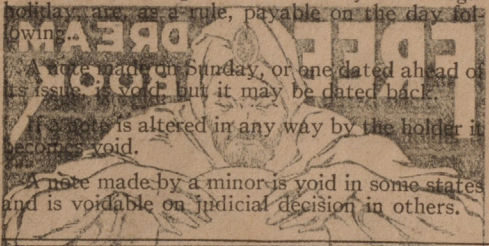
A consideration is not sufficient in law if it is illegal in its nature.

An endorser of a note is exempt from liability if not served with a notice of its dishonor within 24 hours of its non-payment.

If a letter containing notice of protest of non-payment be put into the Post Office, any miscarriage does not affect the party giving notice.

Notice of protest may be sent either to the place of business or residence of the party notified.

A receipt for money is not legally conclusive.

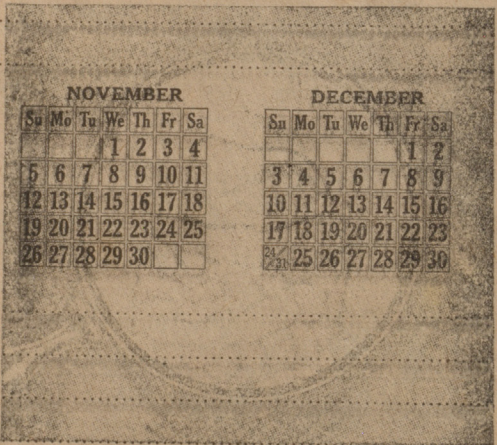
