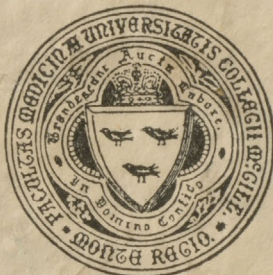

Diploma of the University of Padua, conferring upon Franciscus Bernardus Schnorff of Baden in Switzerland, son of Gwaltherus Schnorff, the degree of doctor of philosophy and medicine, 20 May, 1664 ; subscribed by Raymundus Joannes Fortis, president, Joannes Georgius Noessler, syndic, and Hieronymus Frigimelica ; with notarial attestation. Attached are three seals, namely those of the University of Padua, of St. Mark of Venice, and of the German nation of artists in the University. In an end pocket is a modern English translation on paper.

Eight of the diplomas catalogued here were sent to McGill University by Sir Wm. Osler, 1907-13, this one and the next (no. 7543) with the following note :

Diplomas in the form of a small quarto book, with the special style of decoration seen in these, and in a handsome binding, seem to have been peculiar to Venice (where they were granted by the College of Physicians and by the Company of Aromatarii, or Apothecaries) and to the universities of Northern Italy . . . The seals are nearly always wanting, so that these diplomas [nos. 7542-3] are unusually perfect and well-preserved specimens. [W. O.]

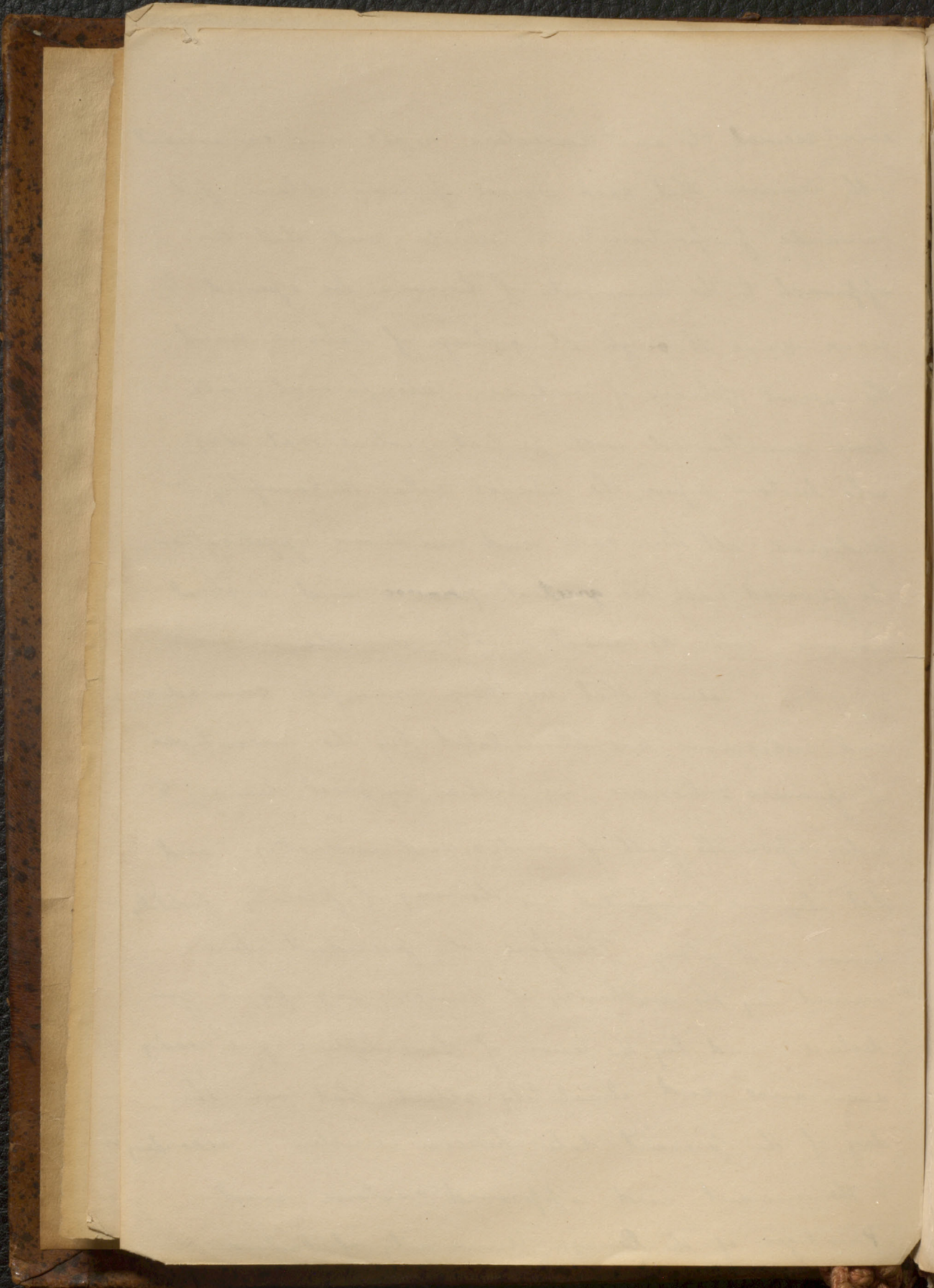
To all and each who will see, read and hear  
this present public Privilege of the Doctorate,  
We, Raimondi <sup>Forti</sup> Giovanni ~~the Biondi~~, Doctor of true  
Philosophy and Medicine; and public Professor,  
in the Noble Academy of Padua, of the Ordinary  
Practice of Medicine in first rank; and of  
the renowned Order of Masters of Philosophy &  
Doctors of Medicine and Professors, President,  
by the Authority of Venice, etc., wish Health  
in him, who is the true Health of all. The

2) ancient and distinguished University of Padua,  
glorious mother of belles-lettres, and best  
Parent of the Sciences (which, by the splendor  
of Most Illustrious Doctors, by the authority  
of time-honored Studies, by Brilliant monu-  
ments of learning and of all virtues, doth  
hold the Primacy among Academies, not only  
of Italy, but of all Europe and the world over)  
admitteth up to the most high degree of the Doc-  
torate those whom she hath by a rigorous exami-  
nation shewn worthy of the crown. For it hath

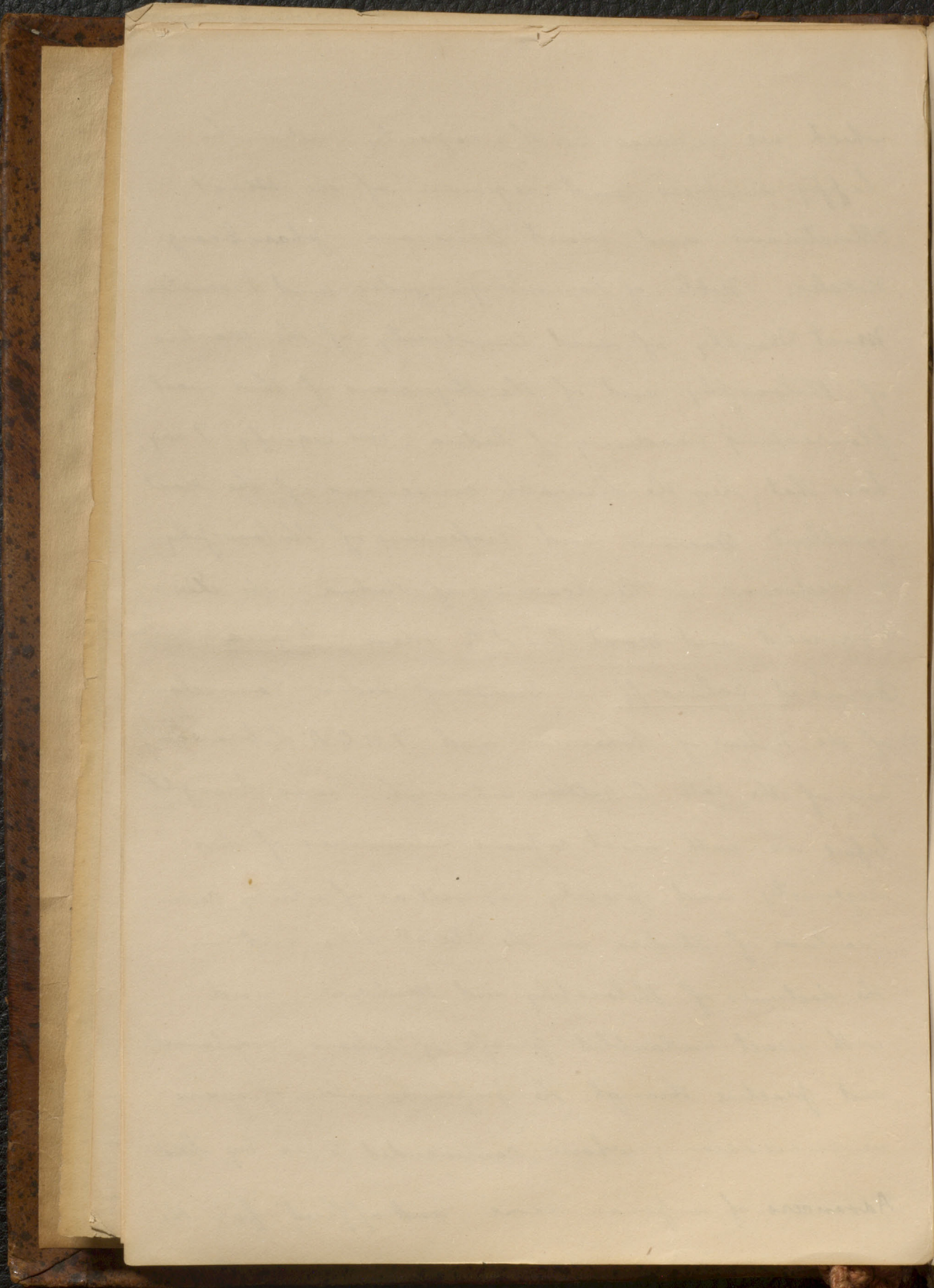




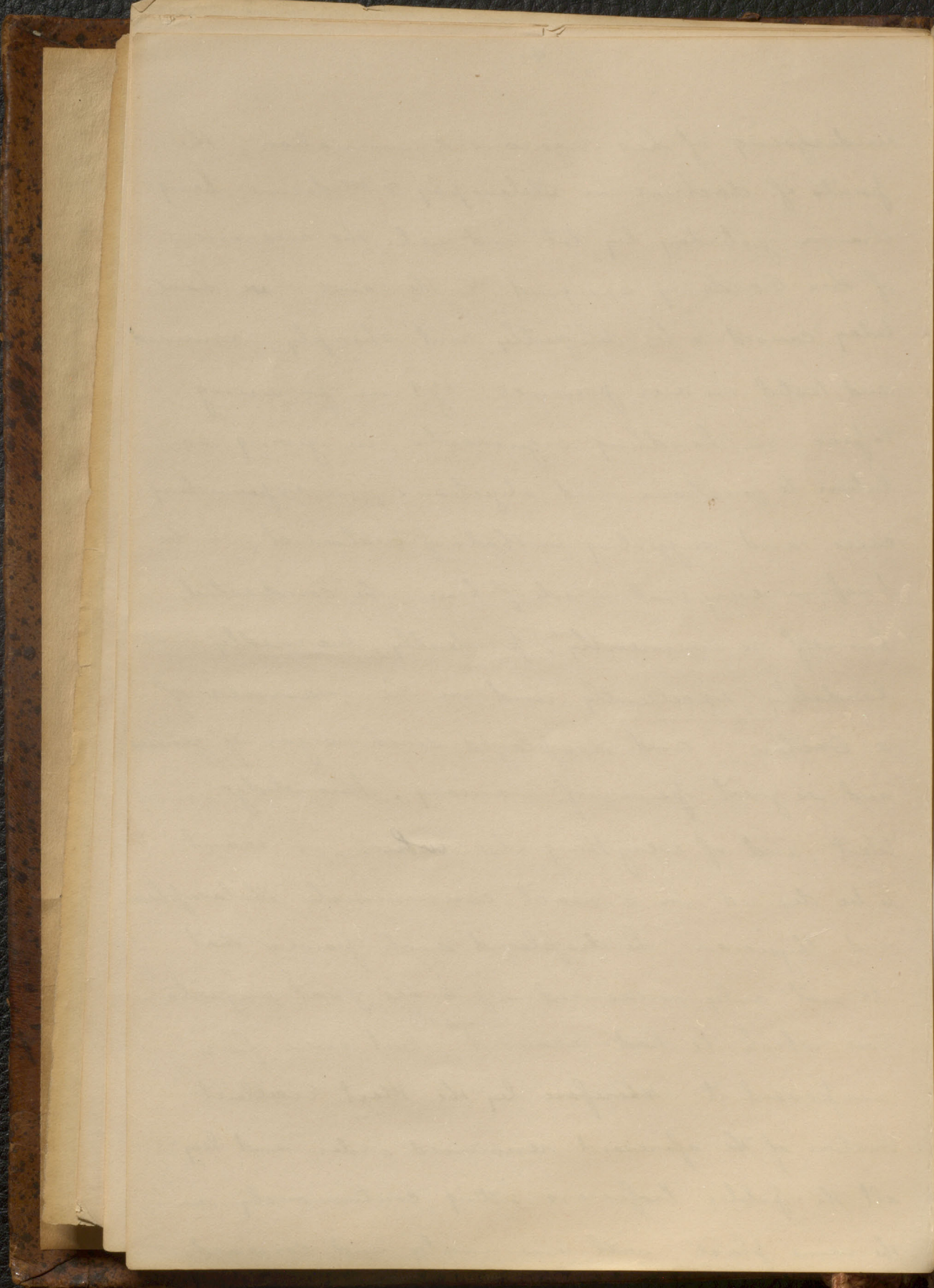
ever seemed to our Ancestors right and consonant

 of praises & honors, as well as by great desire, to  
 enter upon the path of virtue and industry, and  
 that they are comforted in the way of probity, fidelity,  
 honor and glory. Therefore we, president afore-  
 named by the authority of Venice, signify to you,

 assurance, and absolutely attest that on the

 Privileges of the Benign University of Padua



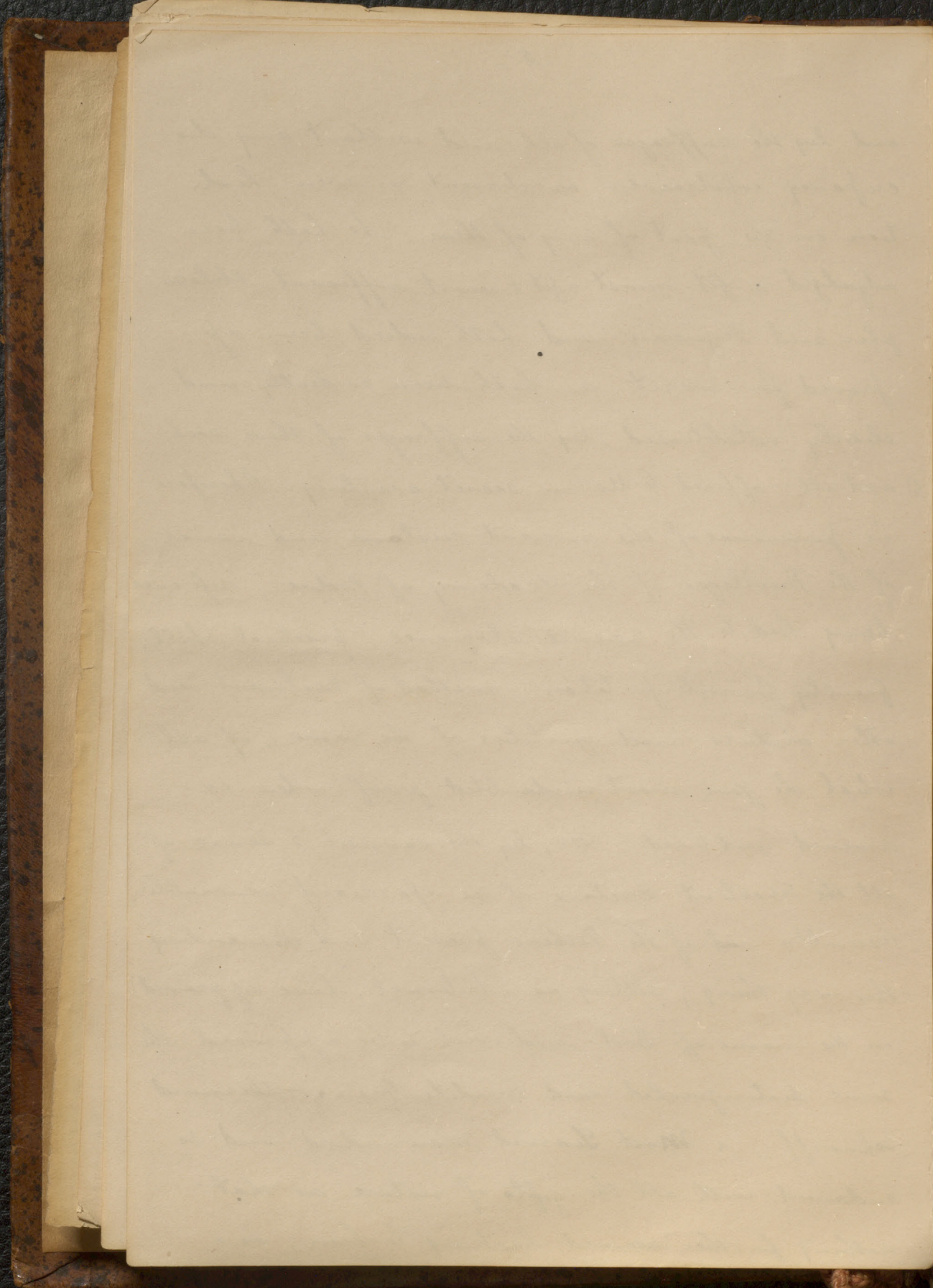
which we exercise in this capacity under the  
 happy auspices and regimen of the Most  
 Illustrious and Most Generous Johann Georg  
 Noesler Noble of Norinberg Syndic and Protector  
 Most Worthy of said University of the Masters  
 of Philosophy and of the Physicians of this most  
 flourishing Academy of Padua, (we signify) I say,  
 how that, by the Venerable consensus of the Most  
 Excellent Doctors and Professors of Philosophy  
 & Medicine in the Academy of Padua, the Dis-  
 tinguished and most Erudite Man, Franz  
Bernard Schnorff a Swiss of Baden, Counselor  
 ④ of the Nation of Bohemia and J.N.G.A. Librarian,  
 Son of the late G. Walther Schnorff, was brought  
 before us with most copious testimonies of his  
 ingenuity and probity as well as of a daily cur-  
 riculum of Studies in the liberal arts and in  
 the doctrines of Philosophy and Medicine, and  
 with most undoubted proofs of labors, vigilance

Yet in pursuing topics, in handling arguments, in giving solution to questions and objections, in expounding cases and suggesting methods of treatment, to be brief, in every trial made of him, he conducted himself so eminently, prudently, learnedly, laudably, excellently and in the manner of a Doctor, and displayed such vigor of genius and so great power of memory, knowledge, talent, and of everything else which is wont to be desired in a most consummate Philosopher and Physician, he displayed such power that he not only measured up to the great expectation which he had aroused <sup>among all</sup>, but even far surpassed it. Wherefore by the Most Excellent Doctors of the aforesaid renowned order and by all the public Professors sitting continuously in the same place, with unanimity and concord &

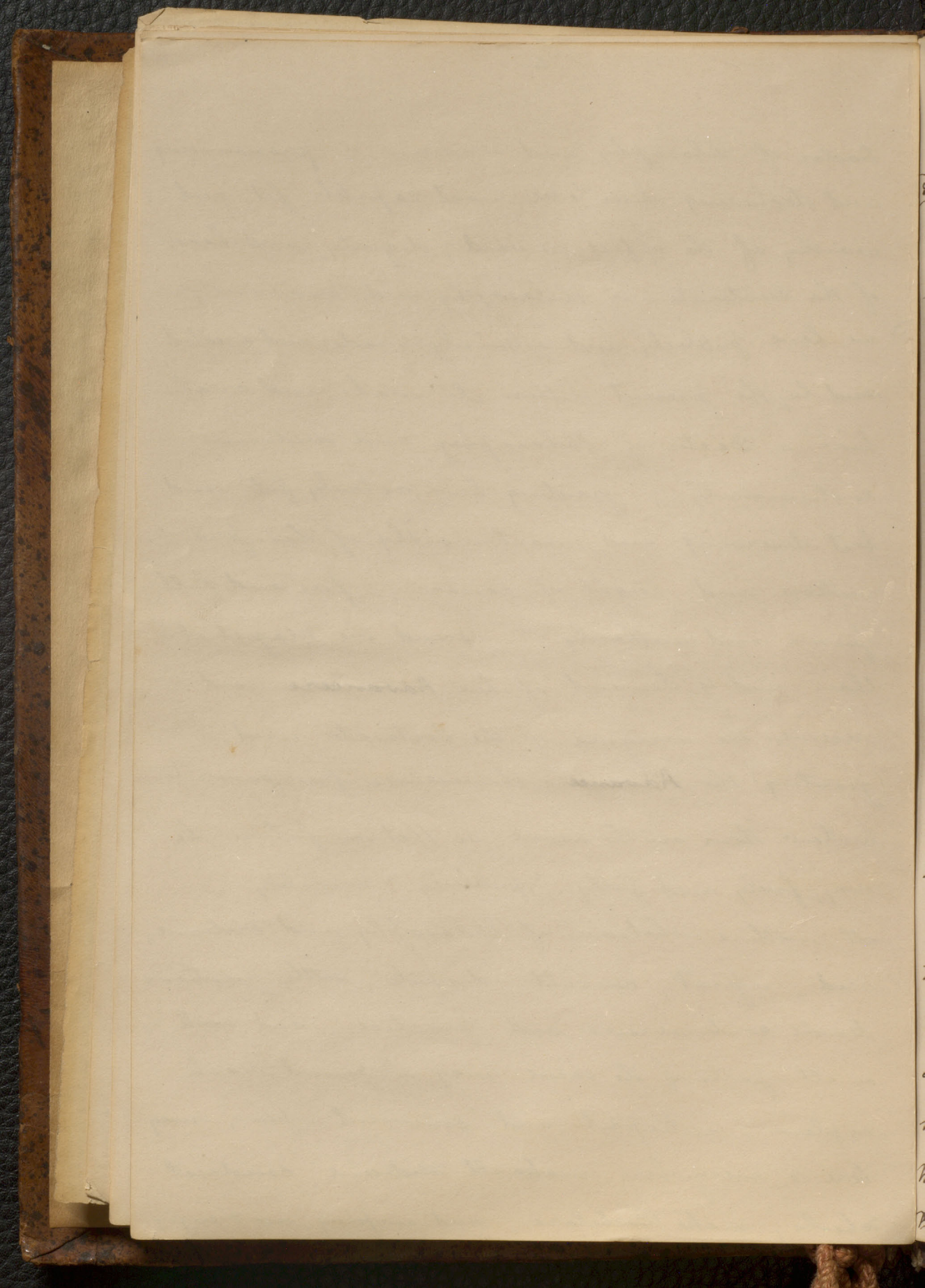


and by the suffrages of all and without any discrepancy whatsoever or dissent or even hesitation on the part of any of them, he hath been adjudged a fit most apt & most sufficient Philosopher and Physician and hath indeed been approved for merit as hath been evidently and clearly established by the suffrages of them each and all offered to us in secret scrutiny. Therefore in pursuance of the ancient custom and sense of the Privileges of the Academy of Padua, reference being had to the science, eloquence, practical skill, faculty for interpretation, method of treatment and other virtues and qualities of the same, of all which he gave most undoubted proof when examined and tried, We, by the counsel & sense of all the Excellent Doctors of the aforesaid venerable Assembly and of the Fathers present and demanding this very thing, sitting as a tribunal, have approved in the name of God and wish to be approved the same distinguished and Erudite Man; Bernard Schnorff, a Most Learned Man indeed and so endowed with all the gifts of nature as that nothing further seemed lacking to him, as a

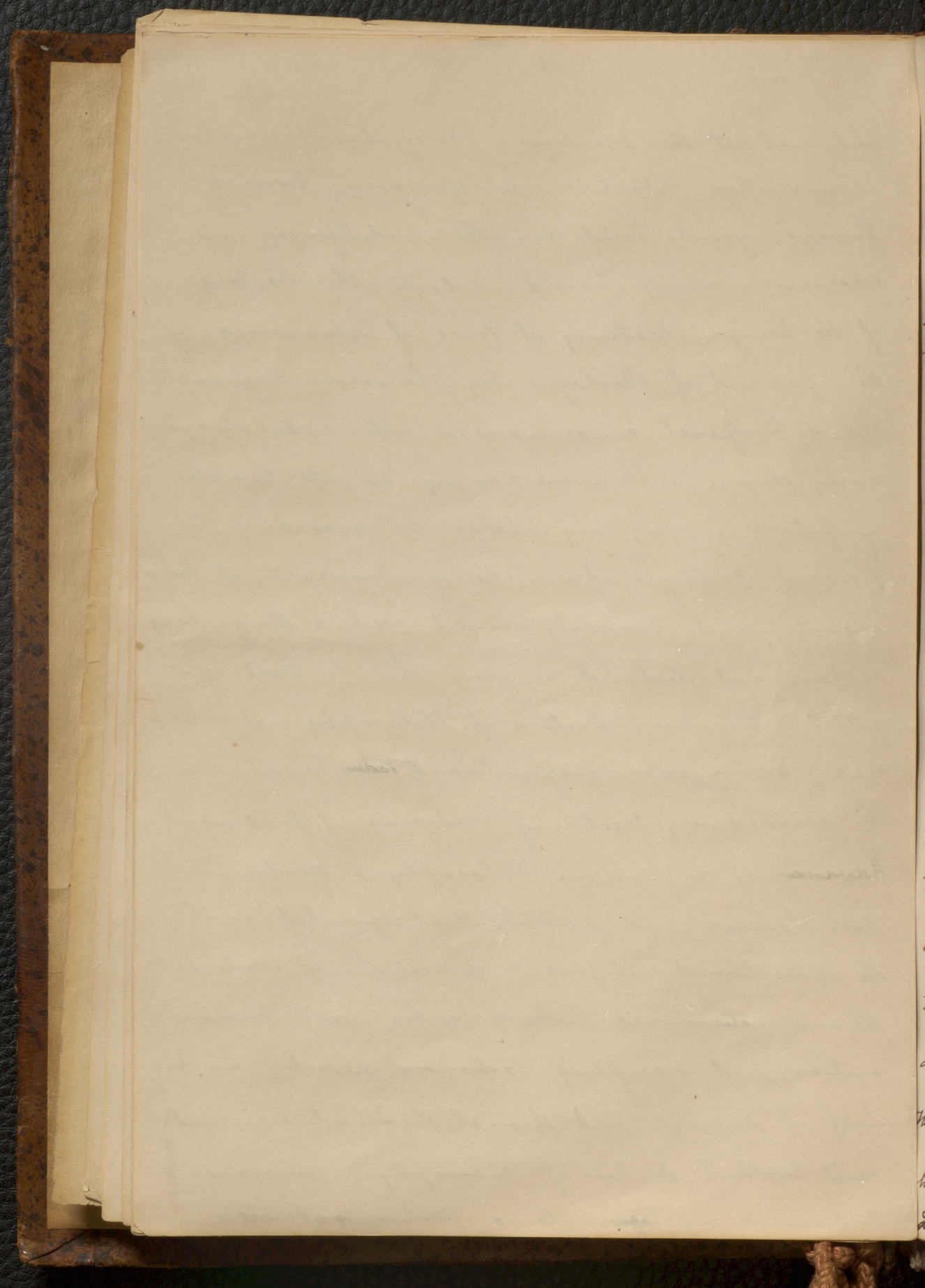




Doctor of Philosophy and Medicine ; pronouncing

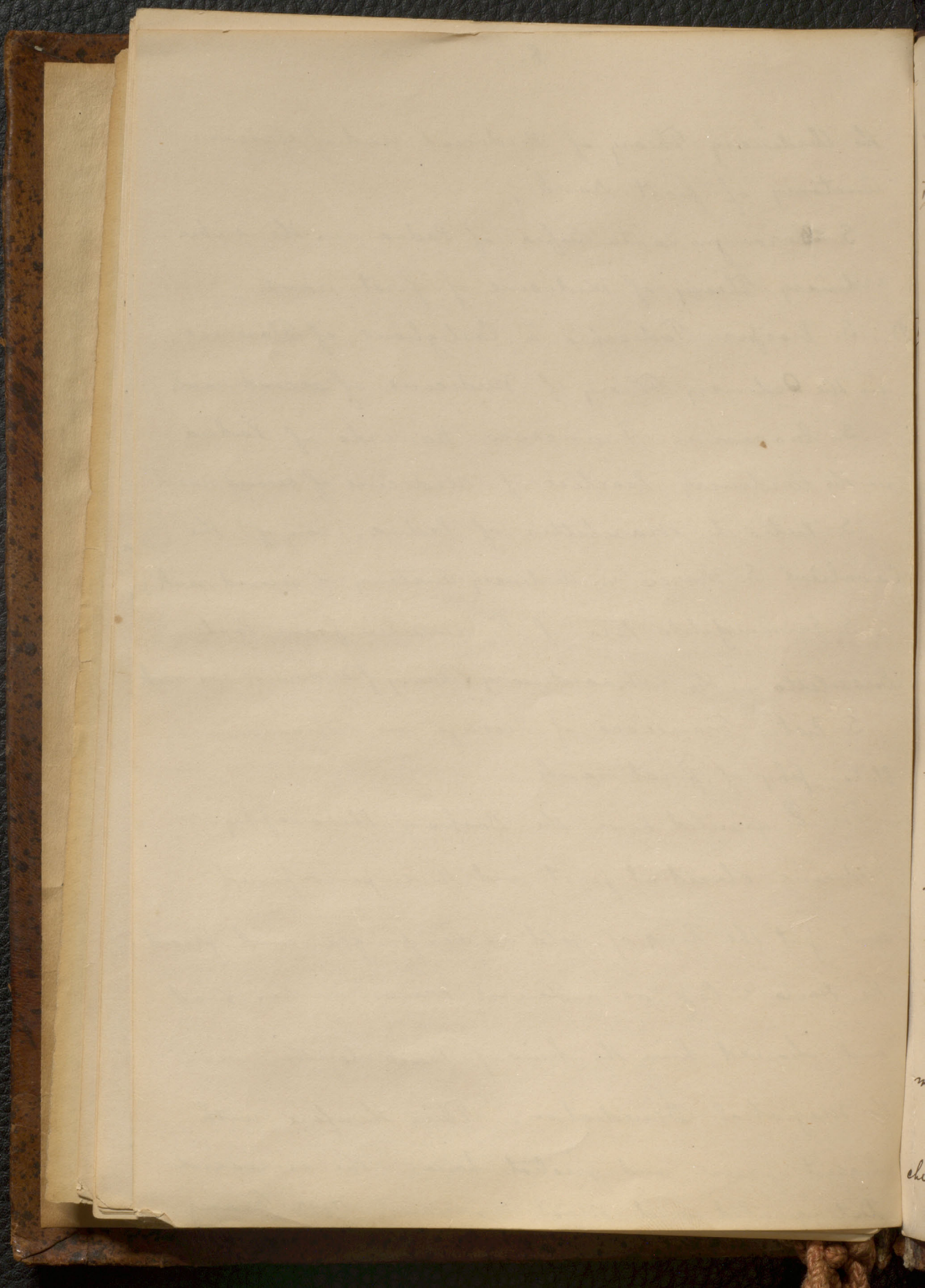

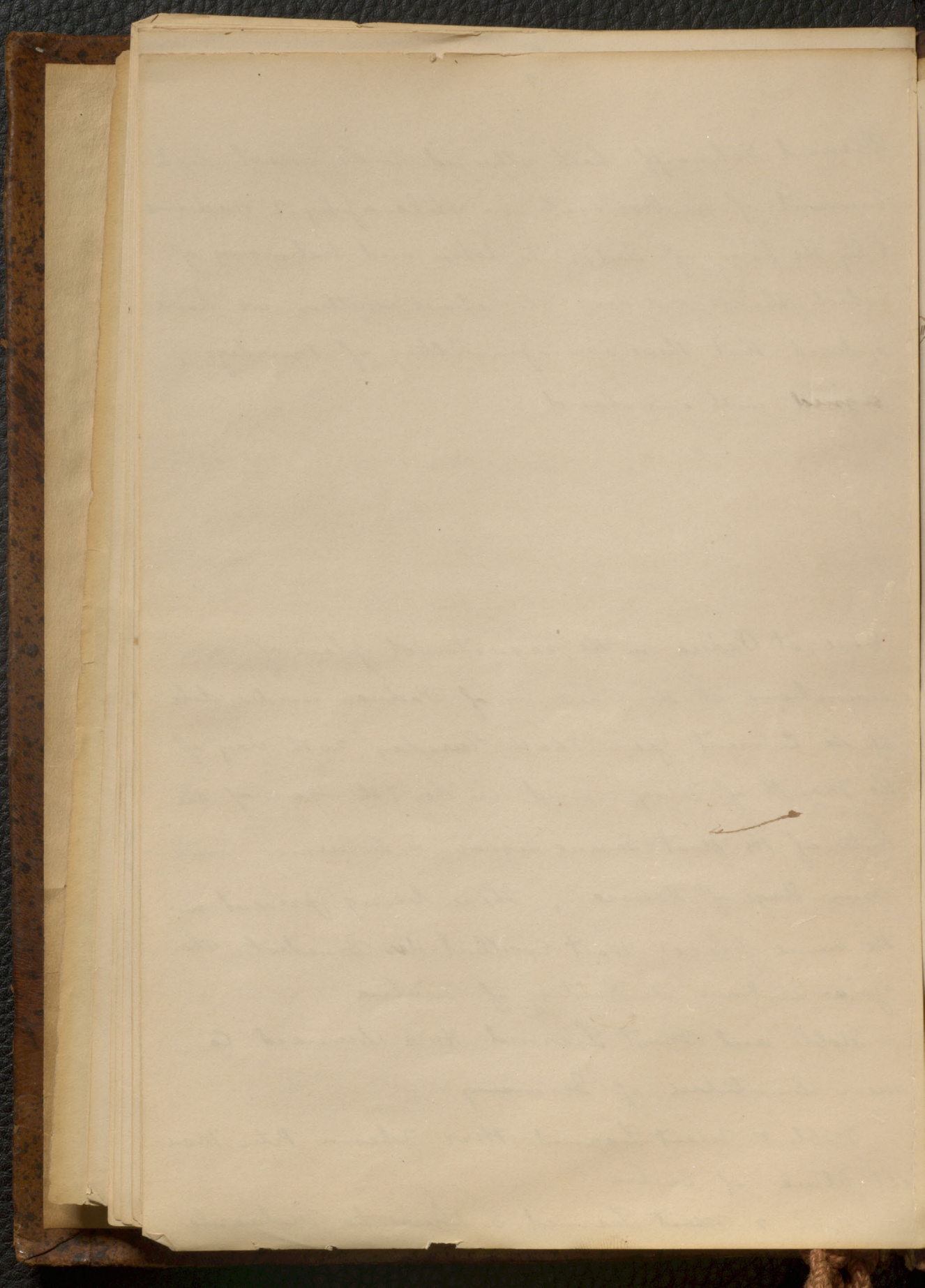
